If you are new to the guild, here are the details:

- Guild members gather all the items they no longer want and donate them for the R'auktion.
- There is an auctioneer and members bid on the items they would like to win. Highest bid wins.
- There are also items that are raffled (you buy tickets).
- All proceeds to go the Guild Treasury.
- Denise Allee will be collecting items at the 9/11, 9/25, and 10/9 meetings

## Saturday Stitch-In

November 8th from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. will be the second 2014 Cherokee Rose Stitch-In in the ballroom in the Ike Owings Community Center at Hunter Park. Plan your projects, bring your machine and plan to spend a day quilting and quilting and quilting!!! The cost is just \$10.

## CRQG Program News

We have some exciting things lined up for you at the next three meetings, so pay close attention as you will need to bring “stuff.”

- At the **September 11** day meeting, Emma Parker will teach the Creative Grids Log Cabin Trim Tool. She will concentrate on using the 12” and 6” tool. Joany Orsi at Pickleweeds gave us a great price on these rulers and orders were taken by Linda Jones at the August night meeting and by email/phone for those interested. (If you took advantage of this opportunity, don’t forget to go by Pickleweeds and pick up your ruler before the meeting!) However, there is also an 8” tool and a curve tool in which you might be interested. Bring your normal sewing supplies and sewing machine. Emma will provide many scraps from which you can choose. If you would prefer a specific color way, bring scraps or strips cut as follows:

For the: 6” ruler - 2” center square and strips slightly larger than 1.25”

8” ruler - 2.5” center square and strips slightly larger than 1.5”

12” ruler - 3.5” center square and strips slightly larger than 2” wide

We will sew until 3:00 p.m. so please bring your lunch and enjoy.

- Our **September 25** night meeting is our long awaited “**Challenge Quilt**” presentation. Just what did our creative members do with that lovely fat quarter and the parameters they were given? Come and see for yourself! Libby Armstrong will send out instructions as to bringing and displaying your quilt creations prior to the big night, so watch your email.
- Finally, at our **October 9** day meeting, Marge Frost will teach us how to use old neckties to make a vest! Here are some tips that will help us prepare for the Necktie Vest:
  - Find a pattern you like. It should not have any darts or princess style seams because you will want to lay the necktie strips on a flat muslin base.
  - It is a good idea to make a muslin sample to be sure of fit, length etc.
  - You will want to have the neckties taken apart before you come to the meeting, as the process can be a bit tedious. By the way, you do not have to use ties! Any mix of fabric strips will work. And, you can also use the technique to create a great looking pillow.
  - Additional info. about supplies will be distributed prior to the meeting.


