

On July 9, join us to make a Four-in-one Placemat. The placemats will give you a quick and easy gift. Some of the themes and fabrics for your placemats could be: four seasons, four holidays to coordinate with the fabulous center pieces you have made, or just four luscious fabrics you are wondering how to use. These placemats make perfect gifts for any occasion or what a nice surprise gift for someone who lives alone. I could go on but you get the gist. We have sold all of the templates; however, you can still participate in the class. We can provide you with access to the templates and a copy of the shape.

Bring your sewing machine, sewing supplies, pellon and those special fabrics (four fat quarters). If you do not have the fusible pellon you can still learn the technique and participate in the class. You can decide later if you want your placemats to have interfacing.

Our July 23rd night meeting will be “Christmas in July” with a visit from the quilt shop, Quilts n Fixins. We will see what’s new this year for Christmas and they will bring a lot of goodies to show and sell.
