Hello everyone,

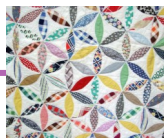

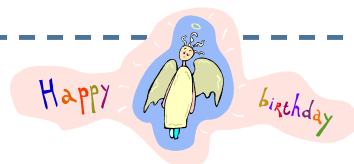

Challenge Quilt 2015

2015 marks the Silver Jubilee of the Cherokee Rose Quilt Guild. In honor of our 25th birthday, the challenge quilt is simply "25". **The quilts will be displayed and judged at the September 24th meeting.** Judging will be done by the membership.

Cash prizes will be given for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place. The rules are as follows:

1. The quilt must be a flat 3 layer quilt. No bags, jackets, vests etc. Table runners, table toppers and the like are acceptable.
2. The minimum size is 25 inches square or in diameter.
3. The maximum size is 250 inches around the perimeter of the quilt.
4. There must be a representation of a Cherokee Rose on the front of the quilt. This can be an embellishment you make, embroidered, painted etc. Use your imagination and creativity!
5. The number 25 must be represented on the front of the quilt. This can be 25 blocks, 25 colors, 25 fabrics the number 25 etc. Again, have fun and be creative.
6. The quilt must be completely finished to be eligible for judging. However, if for some reason you don't get your completed, bring it anyway to share so that everyone can see how creative our members are.
7. DO NOT put your name on the front of the quilt. If you do, make sure the name is covered for the purpose of judging.

Telephone - Queen called herself.

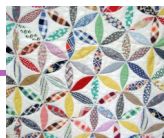
There was no old or new business.

A sign up list will begin in September. It was decided that the Pot Luck will be used for lunch and dinner. Less to take home and an opportunity for everyone to taste everything!!!

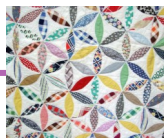

Diamond Rects Day Program – September 10, 2015

Precut your fabrics before the program, according to the directions below.

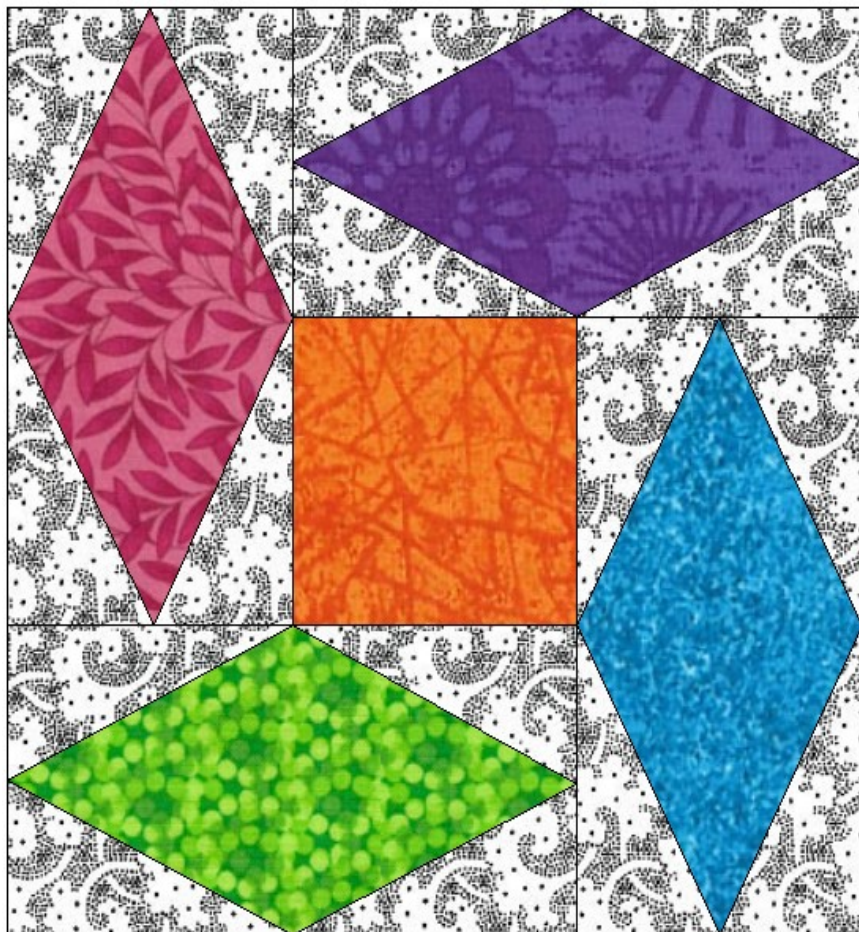
After cutting bring these and all remaining fabrics

For the Diamond: Cut 1 Strip – $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF from **each** of you Four Colors

(If using scraps: Pieces need to be $2\frac{1}{2}$ " wide x at least 5" long)

For the Background: Cut 4 Strips – $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF

For the Small Center Square: Need 20 Squares $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " (cut at least 4)



Supplies to Bring

Your Precut Fabrics and all remaining fabrics

Diamond Rects Ruler
Sea Glass Pattern

Sewing Machine, Foot Control,
Cords, Bobbins, Thread, Pins,
Thread Snips or Small Scissors,
Seam Ripper, etc.

$\frac{1}{4}$ Foot or equivalent item

*Other Ruler: 6 x 12 **or** 5 x 5
or $6\frac{1}{2}$ x $6\frac{1}{2}$ **or** $2\frac{1}{2}$ x 6

*Rotary Mat: 12 x 12 **or** 8 x 8
or 6 x 6 **or** 4 x 6
Rotating Mats are helpful

45mm Rotary Cutter

***Other Ruler and Cutting Mat:** Bring **one** of what you have that is close to any of the sizes. If you don't have, I will have some to borrow.

The Rauction is Coming!!

The famous Cherokee Rose Rauction will be October 22nd and it will be great once again! Here are some FAQs to help you plan for this event:

What is the Rauction? It's a combination Raffle and Auction of quilting supplies, fabric, UFOs and similar items donated by Cherokee Rose members and friends. You can buy raffle tickets for some items and also bid on box lots and individual items.

What donations are wanted? Quilt-shop-quality fabrics, notions, patterns and books, sewing machines, lights, quilt racks, quilts, UFOs (from blocks to quilt tops), and anything else that we would use to make quilts. Please do not donate miscellaneous scraps, polyester or knit fabrics, or magazines.

When can I make my donation? At every meeting between now and October 22nd - someone will take your items and we will store them until the big day. If you can't make the meeting and have a donation, please contact me.

Who can attend the Rauction? All members and guests! We are happy to share our bounty with nonmembers!

What is the range of bids? Some items start at \$1, others higher - it's up to the auctioneers!

What payments are accepted? Cash and personal checks.

Who gets the proceeds? The Guild receives all the money raised from the Rauction and it's a major source of revenue for our programs and other activities.

What can I do to help? #1 - clean out your sewing room and donate that stuff you will never get around to using! #2 - collect cardboard boxes for us 12" x 18" x 3" or a little larger (like the kinds that 6-packs of canned drinks come in) #3 - help organize the box lots for the auction during the day on October 22nd (contact me if you can help) #4 - come to the Rauction and BID, BID, BID!!!
