Our July 14th day program is "Marbling on Fabric" taught by Ruth Anne Yax. Members should have signed up at the June night meeting for the class. We needed to tell Ruthie how many kits to make up for the program. If you did not sign up, you are welcome to stay, watch, and learn.

Ruth Anne Yax- Marbling on Fabric

July 14th day meeting-2 hr class

To participate you need to bring:

- >< Plastic table cover
- > 12" ruler, or paint stirrer, or wooden slat- This is used to spread out the shaving cream
- **≫** Roll of paper towels
- ★ Cheap shaving cream (no aloe) dollar store is suggested
- ➢ Plastic cheap gloves

- ★ Apron- may get stained
- White **cotton cloth** pre cut into 13" by 9" pieces-Everyone works at a different pace so estimate how many pieces you would like to do, you may cut the pieces smaller

Purchase a kit from Ruth Anne for approximately \$8 for <u>additional</u> harder to find items needed for the class

The July 28th night program is "Christmas in July" presented by Robin Jones of Cottontail Quilts. She will discuss and demonstrate what is new for Christmas 2016, and have many items for sale.

Bulls Eye Block Exchange
