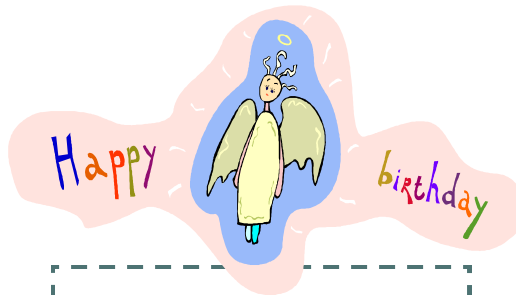

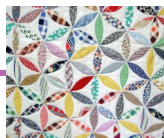

PROGRAM NEWS

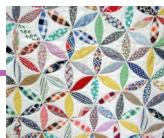
The **September 8th** program is a fall placemat class. The photo and handout of supplies to bring are posted on our [website](#). The guild will provide each member the fusible grid needed to make a placemat. You will need to bring an assortment of fabric and/or 2" squares pre cut. The colors range from yellow-orange to a brown-orange for the pumpkins. In addition bring an assortment of deep blues for the night sky and a couple of small pieces of green for the pumpkin stems. If you do not have all of the colors needed, you can swap fabric squares with some of your quilting buddies. We are also encouraging members to bring a piece of white muslin or solid white cotton to cover your ironing surface. This fabric will help you to see the pre-printed grid on the interfacing. A clover mini iron is

the best pressing tool. Any members who have more than one clover mini iron are encouraged to bring them to help out members who do not own one. It is not necessary for you to bring your sewing machine to participate. Members can plan and press at the class and take their project home to do the sewing. The class will last several hours so you might want to bring your lunch or a snack.



The **September 22nd** night program is the **quilt challenge, "I Love the Holidays!"** All of the rules for the challenge are posted on the web site. If you have labeled your creation, please put a piece of masking tape over your name. You may choose which category you want your project entered in, Artistic or Traditional. If you have been working on a holiday project and it isn't quite finished or you do not want it judged, there will be an area labeled "Show and Tell". Our goal is to get 100% participation!

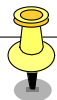
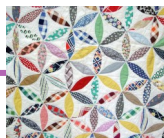

Challenge Quilt—"I Love the Holidays!"

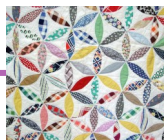
Our members have voted and chose the theme of "I Love the Holidays!" You may choose which holiday you wish to celebrate with your quilt challenge.

Membership: 28 members present including Linda Yearicks, a new member. We have one visitor, Christine Hilliard.

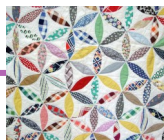
Door prize winners: Christine Hillyer, Susan Fisher, Linda Yearicks
