



PROGRAM NEWS The April 13th day program will be a trunk show by Diane Knott. Diane's specialty is scrap quilting and her new book is Scrap Quilt Secrets. Learn more about Diane at her website, www.butterflythreadsquilting.com. Diane came to our guild in 2015 and we enjoyed a great workshop with her. Tina is planning another workshop with Diane for Saturday, April 29th. The April 27th night program will be strip poker. Come and have some fun playing this game. Bring a dozen 2 1/2 strips, cut selvedge to selvedge. The May 11th day program will be a program on using the 60 degree triangle ruler. We'll be focusing on a couple of patterns known as Triangle Frenzy Swirl and Triangle Frenzy Table Runner (pictured below). The program will be a "sew in" and last until approximately 2:30-3:00 PM. Additional Information on the May 11th Day Program

The May 11th day program will be a program on using the 60 degree triangle ruler. . If you are interested in staying for the program, please let me know so that we can order patterns and rulers from Stitch N Quilt. Pat has offered me a 10% guild discount when I make the order. I will have to double check, but I believe the patterns are \$10 each and the Creative Grids 12.5" (CGRT12560) ruler approx. \$27.

If you prefer, you can use a smaller 60 degree ruler and an 18"- 24" inch straight ruler to cut your triangles. If you're a ruler "junkie" like me, or discover how much fun these projects are, you may want to get the larger ruler! I have found this pattern like a bag of Lays Potato Chips... I can't just make one! I want one for every holiday!!

It would be a good idea to start shopping for your striped fabric, too, as there are some beautiful patterns out there. The patterns suggest a fabric that has 5" - 11" wide stripes with at least 4 repeats across the width of the fabric. However, narrower stripes work great for smaller finished project, too. Here's what you'll need for the class:

- 60 degree triangle ruler (and 18-24 inch straight ruler if using small triangle) \succ
- \succ Rotary Cutter & 18x24 (min) cutting mat
- Scissors (for easier cutting along stripes) \succ
- \succ Sewing Machine
- \succ Pins
- \succ **Basic sewing supplies**
- × Fabric - depending on which pattern you want to make:
 - \times 1-1 1/2 yd striped fabric for the Swirl
 - ℅ 1-2 yd striped fabric for the Table Runner
 - ℅ If you have one long strip (2-3 yds) of a border fabric, that will work too

Don't prewash your fabric. You can use light starch or Best Press if desired to help with the bias edges. Your final size will depend on the width stripe you use. You will need batting and backing about 2 inches larger than the front of your project. 26x54 should fit the Table Runner and 24x40 should fit the Swirl with no problem.

Feel free to contact me with any questions or to let me know what pattern(s) you want, and if you're interested in the 12.5 inch 60 degree triangle ruler. I'll have a sign up list available at the April meetings, as well.

Where do you sew?


