**OCT 11 – O. V. BRANTLEY Trunk Show and Lecture:** Her Quilts Encourage Living a Life of Simple Abundance. She started quilting to relieve stress, but now she quilts for the sheer joy of it. Her quilts have become such a part of her life that she renovated the attic in her home to have a private studio that she calls para-dise. Her quilts tend to be inspirational and autobiographical and tries to convey the importance of living a life of simple abundance with joy and gratitude. **NOV 8 - ELISABETH FROLET** -Ms. Frolet, is a French immigrant to the US and an Atlanta resident since the mid 1990s. She stumbled upon quilting in the early 90s while still living in France and was THUNDERSTRUCK by it. Quilting was virtually unknown in France at that time and she had to teach herself, working with pictures of quilts. Quilting very quickly became her favorite hobby. In the late 2000s she started teaching at Little Quilts and 3 years ago at Tiny Stitches. She started entering her quilts in quilt shows about 5 years ago and has won a few ribbons, including a couple at Paducah and Houston. This program is free to members, \$5 for visitors and promises to be thrilling!

**OCT 25 – RAUCTION:** It's the event you've been waiting for. Whether you wish to buy or donate, it's a BIG night for our guild. This is our main money-making source so please help us. The money sustains our guild for many things such as programs, rent and more than you want to know. We need volunteers to help set up but most of all to donate good cotton fabrics suitable for quilting, folded nicely as you would want to receive them and good yardage. She will share her journey and passion for the relationship between what's old and what's new and how the old and new exist on a continuum rather than in a vacuum, exclusive of one another. Throughout generations quilt making provided women with platforms for their artistic and political voices, as well as their expressions of love and necessities of utility. She will talk about women's lives, women's voice and we will rejoice in our legacies.
