August 26th, Night Meeting: Sandy Vickers. "Weathervane"

Remember to record your name, quilt, details in the Golden Scissors book at meetings.

A Golden Scissor Charm is awarded for a completed quilt with a minimum measurement of 220" around the perimeter of the quilt.

Golden Scissors Rules

- The quilt should be completed in the same year the award is given.
- The quilt must be completely finished, quilted and bound.
- There must be a quilt label sewn into or onto the quit with at least the quilters name and date.
- The quilter presenting the quilt must have pieced the top.
- Piecing can be done by hand or by machine.
- Block-of-the-month, friendship, and round robin quilts assembled by the owner qualify for Awards.
- Whole cloth quilts are acceptable: however, no cheater quilts.
- Quilting may be either by hand or machine.
- Professional machine quilting and tied quilts are acceptable
- After earning 5 Golden Safety Pin Awards, they may be exchanged for 1 Golden Scissor Award
- Both a written record of the Award and a Photo will be kept permanently by the guild.
- The record will include: the quilter's name, the name of the quilt and awards given

They also have every type of embroidery you dream about; from the 30's designs to more modern patterns, toweling and embroidery supplies. Don't be put off by the hoarding ambiance... they really have tons of to die for quilting supplies! And best of all...Connie the owner of this hidden gem is very sweet and friendly and welcoming to us out of towners! The shop is worth visiting if you happen to be in the Cedar Rapids area.

The Woolen Needle 225 W. Welsh St. Williamsburg, Iowa (319) 668-3643

Okay; first thing to know is this shop is in the wonderfully restored village of Williamsburg, which is a great place to spend a day visiting the old village, and various shops. Then have lunch in one of the wonderful restaurants and stroll over to visit this quilt shop!

They specialize in wool of course, also historic fabric reproductions. They have wool in every color you ever dreamed of, also a supply of all things embroidery. They have kits, and they've all read the Outlander books; so we had much in common as we discussed their Scottish wool plaids and tartans!
