A & E Fabrics, Pensacola, FL Susan Fisher

Years ago, when I was at a quilt show in Pensacola I heard about a unique fabric shop, A & E Drugs. I was a bit skeptical but followed the directions (pre-GPS days) to a somewhat sketchy commercial street. The parking lot was oyster shells, not that unusual for the Panhandle, but not exactly what one would expect for either a drug or fabric store.

A & E Drugs occupied several storefronts in a quasi-strip mall. The parking lot was dusty, the signage was dusty, the windows were dusty. The only thing that kept me from driving away were the many cars out front with quilty bumper stickers.

Back then, the main room was a drug store with pharmacist, three mis-matched chairs where one could wait for one's prescription and shelves of drug store stuff. To the right was a big room of Mardi Gras supplies, massive boxes of beads and whatever. But from the left I could hear the buzz of women, lots of women, so I took a deep breath and walked through the doorway. Oh, my! Through the Looking Glass, Alice! The place was jammed with quilters pushing shopping carts loaded with bolts of fabric. And what was the day's lesson? Never judge a book by its cover or a quilt shop by its parking lot or neighbors.

Nowadays the parking lot is paved, the Mardi Gras bead room is still there but the drug store is gone and the sign now reads, A & E Fabrics with a barn quilt painted by Cena Harmon as part of the Gulf Coast Quilt Trail.

There is even more fabric now, thousands and thousands of bolts of fabric arranged in aisles according to novelties, seasons, patterns and on and on. A wall of batiks, hundreds of batiks. A wall of solids. A room of wide backs. Plus threads, quilting and sewing notions, books, patterns and a smaller area for yarns, knitting and crocheting supplies.

Each bolt of fabric is labeled by the year of manufacture. The day I was there, all 2018-2020 bolts were 20% off, older than that, 40% off. Of course, the fabric I chose was new and full price, but the prices are reasonable. I think the most expensive I found was \$11.99. If you have a guild membership card, that's another discount. They have a reward system for each dollar spent either in the store or online at andefabrics.com.

AND, even though it's a big place, it has a very relaxed atmosphere with the customer service of a little shop. Plenty of people with encyclopedic knowledge of the inventory more than happy to help find that elusive print. While I was there, the woman helping two neophyte quilters take forever and a day to choose three fabrics (I was so tempted to just intervene and point at one, two and three!) was supposed to go to lunch but she said, "No, I'll go after I finish with these ladies."

If you're anywhere in the vicinity of Pensacola, make the detour to A & E Fabrics, and when you're advised to grab a shopping cart before you start shopping, do it!

#### Remember to record your name, quilt, details in the Golden Scissors book at meetings.

A Golden Scissor Charm is awarded for a completed quilt with a minimum measurement of 220" around the perimeter of the quilt.

#### **Golden Scissors Rules**

- The quilt should be completed in the same year the award is given.
- The guilt must be completely finished, guilted and bound.
- There must be a quilt label sewn into or onto the quit with at least the quilters name and date.
- The quilter presenting the quilt must have pieced the top.
- Piecing can be done by hand or by machine.
- Block-of-the-month, friendship, and round robin quilts assembled by the owner qualify for Awards.
- Whole cloth quilts are acceptable: however, no cheater quilts.
- Quilting may be either by hand or machine.
- Professional machine quilting and tied quilts are acceptable
- After earning 5 Golden Safety Pin Awards, they may be exchanged for 1 Golden Scissor Award.
- Both a written record of the Award and a Photo will be kept permanently by the guild.
- The record will include: the quilter's name, the name of the quilt and awards given
