Challenge Quilt 2022

This year's challenge is to illustrate a song that has special meaning for you, or a song that brings back memories, or a song that you simply enjoy,

Illustrate the song title or any portion of the lyrics from your song. All music styles are eligible (i.e. hymns, country western, Christmas carols, opera, musicals, etc.). The song lyrics you choose may be improvisations of the original lyrics.

The project size is wall hanging or smaller. Your project does not have to be quilt, but it must be a finished project made mostly with fabric and thread.

Your project must be something that you made. For example, if your favorite cat from the Broadway musical is Bustopher Jones, you should make Bustopher as a black cat with white spats and then stuff him like he belongs to 8 or 9 clubs. Dressing up a store-bought toy cat in a black tuxedo does not qualify.

Panel pieces are allowed, but not more than one-quarter of your project may contain an intact panel or a portion of a panel.

Challenge entries will be grouped into 2 categories:

Traditional Quilt - a quilted project with a top, batting, back, and binding; and, Other - a finished project that is not a traditional quilt.

You may enter multiple projects in each category, but only your project which receives the highest vote total will be eligible for a prize. Entries will be submitted and exhibited at the October night meeting. Meeting attendees will vote for first, second, and third places in each category. Winners will be announced during the October night meeting and small prizes will be awarded.

Remember to record your name, quilt, details in the Golden Scissors book at meetings.

A Golden Scissor Charm is awarded for a completed quilt with a minimum measurement of 220" around the perimeter of the quilt.

Golden Scissors Rules

- The quilt should be completed in the same year the award is given.
- The quilt must be completely finished, quilted and bound.
- There must be a quilt label sewn into or onto the quit with at least the quilters name and date.
- The quilter presenting the quilt must have pieced the top.
- Piecing can be done by hand or by machine.
- Block-of-the-month, friendship, and round robin quilts assembled by the owner qualify for Awards.
- Whole cloth quilts are acceptable: however, no cheater quilts.
- Quilting may be either by hand or machine.
- Professional machine quilting and tied quilts are acceptable
- After earning 5 Golden Safety Pin Awards, they may be exchanged for 1 Golden Scissor Award.
- Both a written record of the Award and a Photo will be kept permanently by the guild.
- The record will include: the quilter's name, the name of the quilt and awards given

Atlanta Quilt Festival Exhibit August 7, 2022 – September 2, 2022 Southwest Arts Center, 915 New Hope RD, Atlanta GA 30331 (NEW LOCATION)

The Atlanta Quilt Festival, Inc. (AQF) is pleased to announce its annual quilt competition. In keeping with the mission of the Atlanta Quilt Festival, all interpretations are welcome. The exhibition is open to all quilt makers.

This is a juried exhibition focusing on Traditional, Art, Modern and African American Heritage quilts. All quilts must have three (3) layers (top, batting and backing). Quilts should not exceed 60 inches by 60 inches.

Ribbons and a \$50 cash prize, in each category, will be awarded for best Traditional, Art, Modern, African American Heritage with \$100 for Best in Show.

- Entries accepted beginning March 2, through July 1, 2022. including photos and \$10.00 entry fee per quilt. Mail to Atlanta Quilt Festival, 505 Stonebriar Way, SW, Atlanta, GA 30331 or email entry form to atlantaquiltfestival@gmail.com.
- Quilts may not exceed 60 inches by 60 inches and must have a hanging sleeve and label on the back with your name and name of quilt.
- Submit at least one full view of the completed quilt and one detail view. There is no limit as to the number of quilts that may be submitted, however separate entry forms are required for each quilt.
- Digital images may be submitted via email atlantaquiltfestival@gmail.com. You may crop the background only.
- The entry fee is non-refundable and is applied to the cost of presenting the exhibition.
- If you mail your quilt, <u>please include return postage</u> of \$10 for your quilt(s).

Congressman Lewis was a long-time civil rights leader who marched with Dr. Martin Luther King. There is much information online and in books about Congressman Lewis that can inform your creativity. He was a great man who loved quilts.

The exhibit will be displayed during the annual Atlanta Quilt Festival August 1 - 31, 2022 at the Southwest Arts Center located at 915 New Hope Road, South Fulton, GA 30331. Your quilt will be available for pickup or return September 6, 20022. The exhibit is by invitation only and there is no fee for entry.

Due to limited space, quilts should not exceed 60 inches wide. Completed quilts must be **received** by the Atlanta Quilt Festival no later than **July 23**, **2022**.

There is **NO entry fee** for this exhibit.
