MARCH IS NATIONAL QUILTING MONTH!

PRESIDENT'S DESK

From nearly the first guild meeting I attended, I've volunteered to hold up quilts during show and tell, trunk shows, and for special speakers. While the quilter is talking, I'm behind the quilt looking at the quilting stitches. There is an interesting variety when you have time to look. A few are hand-quilted by very meticulous people. The stitches are small, even, and closely spaced; judges at the Georgia Celebrates Quilts event presented by the East Cobb Quilters' Guild would award high marks. Conversely, some hand stitching is done by people who apparently had a previous career working with hand grenades or nuclear weapons; their quilting stitches exemplify the "close is good enough" attitude.

Machine quilting on a long arm appears to come in 3 categories: fully manual, panto-graphs, and custom programmed, highly intricate computerized patterns complimenting the design on the front of the quilt. My favorite is the artistry of fully manual long arm quilting. And don't forget to pull the loose threads before the meeting. Quilt backs might have 1 or 2 loose threads, but occasionally I'll hold up a quilt with so many threads that I wonder if the quilter's cats sneezed off all their whiskers onto the back of the quilt as it was being folded for the meeting.

After looking at the quilting stitches, what else am I doing while holding up a quilt? I'm listening for the reaction of the meeting attendees as the quilt is unfurled. Since I am on the back side of the quilt and can't see it, your reactions help me imagine what the quilt top looks like. I have 2 categories for audible quilt member reactions. The first is a subdued reaction; a general murmur of oohs and aahs indicating appreciation for a finely crafted quilt. The second is an enthusiastic reaction; a loud, and sometimes prolonged, chorus of oohs and aahs indicating an exceptional quilt. This reaction is generally followed by a lot of questions, and I have more time to study the quilting stitches on the back while questions are answered by the quilter.

If you missed our February night meeting, the guest speaker, Aisha Lumumba, was well into the second category of member reactions. I was behind her quilts wondering if I might someday be present for a third reaction category: Applause and cheers.

Gallon Bag Challenge

If you want to participate in the Gallon Bag Challenge this year, you will need to prepare a gallon bag with various fabrics. You may also include things like buttons, zippers, bells, etc. When your bag is full, write your name on the bag and turn it in to Dawn Feist before the end of the March night meeting.

Your bag will be distributed to one of the challenge participants and you will receive a bag from a different participant in return.

The challenge is to make something for the person whose bag you receive using some or all of the contents of the bag. Your project may include additional fabrics or notions from your stash; you are not limited to the contents of the bag. You decide what you will make and present to that person at a night meeting later in the year. At that meeting, you will also receive a finished project from the person who had your gallon bag



Remember to record your name, quilt, details in the Golden Scissors book at meetings.

A Golden Scissor Charm is awarded for a completed quilt with a minimum measurement of 220" around the perimeter of the quilt.

Golden Scissors Rules

The quilt should be completed in the same year the award is given.

- The quilt must be completely finished, quilted and bound.
- There must be a quilt label sewn into or onto the quit with at least the quilters name and date.
- The quilter presenting the quilt must have pieced the top.
- Piecing can be done by hand or by machine.
- Block-of-the-month, friendship, and round robin quilts assembled by the owner qualify for Awards.
- Whole cloth quilts are acceptable: however, no cheater quilts.
- Quilting may be either by hand or machine.
- Professional machine quilting and tied quilts are acceptable
- After earning 5 Golden Safety Pin Awards, they may be exchanged for 1 Golden Scissor Award.
- Both a written record of the Award and a Photo will be kept permanently by the guild.

The record will include: the quilter's name, the name of the quilt and awards given

The deadline for the April newsletter is March 24th.

Six Ways to Label Your Quilts

There are many different methods you can use to make your own labels, whether they are custom or simple labels.

Depending on what design elements you end up using, here are a few supplies you may need, I'll explain which materials go with which method below:

- Embroidery by hand
- Embroidery by sewing machine
- Pigma pen or other permanent fabric marker
- Inkjet printer
- Preprinted labels
- Twill tape
