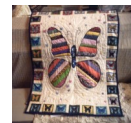

"In the Eyes of the Beholder" 2008 Challenge quilt

The challenge quilt committee wanted to do something a little different this year.

You've heard the saying that "Beauty is in the eyes of the beholder". We're counting on your interpretation and imagination to do what you do best - create beautiful quilts! The themes have already been chosen. You will draw *your* theme from those. No one will have the same theme as anyone else. After that, you're pretty much on your own with just a few rules as listed below. Let your imagination take you to places that no quilter has gone before! Most of all, HAVE FUN!

Once you have drawn a theme it's YOURS.

NO TRADING!

Rules

1. The quilt may be any shape, but the combined total of all sides of the quilt cannot be less than 96 inches or more than 144 inches.
2. The quilt may be any shape - square, rectangle, round, oval etc.
3. The quilt pattern or design must depict the theme.
4. The quilt may be any fabric, pattern, design or method of construction.
5. Quilts may be embellished in any way.
6. If the theme is a color theme, only the colors listed may be used.
7. Interpret the theme any way you see fit (keep it clean).
8. The quilt must be completed by September 25, 2008 and will be judged at the meeting that evening.

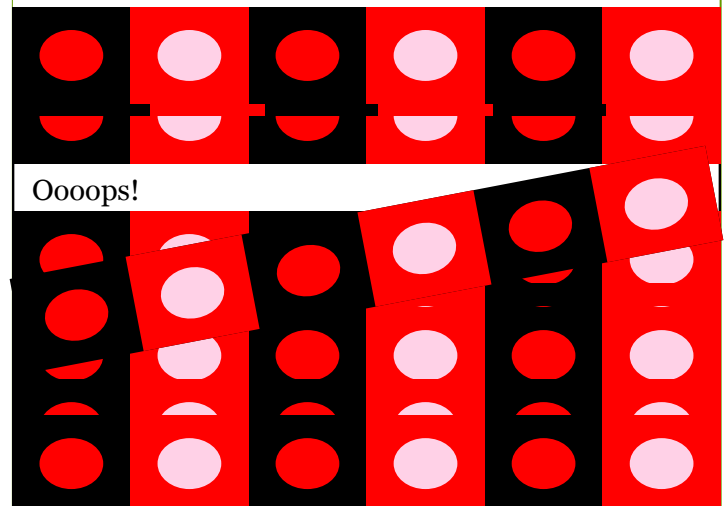
