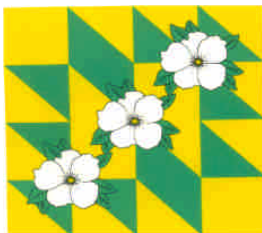

By-laws Amendment (a tiny one!)

We need to restate Section Two of Article Ten, so that if a members wants to read the newsletter online, that member does not need to provide the 12 stamped, self-addressed envelopes.

The current wording is: "Dues, along with a membership form and 12 business envelopes, stamped and self-addressed, are payable at any time during the year except during the Christmas party."

The proposed change would delete that sentence and replace it with this: "Dues, along with a membership form, are payable at any time during the year except during the Christmas party. Members may elect to read their newsletter online by so indicating on the membership form. In order to receive a paper copy of the newsletter in the mail, 12 business envelopes, stamped and self-addressed, must be submitted along with the membership form and dues."
