

Hexagon Fun!

We'll learn two ways to make hexagons for quilts: English Paper Piecing and from circles of fabric. Each participant may choose to make either a mug rug or a pincushion using the hexagon technique of their choice. Once you've learned to make hexagons using these methods, you'll love adding them to your quilts!

General Supply List:

Hand sewing needles (sharp and small such as quilting betweens)

Thread in a neutral color

Scissors

Thimble

Fabric in two coordinating colors (one fat quarter of each)

Circle template measuring about 3" in diameter (wide mouth Mason jar lid is perfect!)

Pen or pencil to mark fabric

For Mug Rug: also need 10" square piece of felt

For Pincushion: also need approximately 1 cup crushed walnut shells (available in pet stores as reptile bedding)

(In addition, Linda Jones plans to bring her Accuquilt circle die to help with cutting out the 3" circles.)
