What other hobbies do you have besides quilting? Oh, my! I'm a craft junkie! I enjoy making custom greeting cards, oil painting, cake decorating, craft painting, sewing, photography and like the Energizer Bunny - the list keeps going!

One way that quilting has changed your life? Quilting has turned me into a Fabriholic! Seriously, it gives me another venue to be creative, and has introduced me to some wonderful people; especially here at CRQG.
