President's Message

Happy New Year!! What can we learn this year and what UFOs can we finish?

Several years ago, when I was president of the Mississippi Quilt Association, I received an email from Naomi Ichiwaka, editor of <u>Patchwork Quilt</u> tsushin (magazine), Japan's oldest quilt magazine with circulation second only to <u>Quilter's Newsletter</u>. She was going to be traveling through Mississippi and wanted to interview several Mississippi quilters for her magazine. Each issue (6/year) has an article on quilters in one state or country around the world. She gave me a list of cities she would visit and I set up meetings with quilters. One thing she particularly wanted to do was visit a guild. The members of the Natchez guild arranged a pot-luck supper and show-and-tell for Naomi. Naomi was fascinated with the fact that U. S. quilters are so sharing of their knowledge. In Japan, quilters are very secretive and never display their work in progress. If a quilt is not perfect, it is thrown away and never shown.

Since most of us are self-taught quilters, perhaps we can benefit from quickie lessons from our more experienced members. For a long time my blocks never matched up because I didn't know about a scant quarter inch seam. I didn't know to square up my blocks before sashing. I'll ask some of our members to do mini-lessons (5 minutes) at some of our meetings.

If there is enough interest, we could have a Saturday workshop on basics.

The other thing I'd like for us to work on is making new members feel like part of the group. I talked with one new member who said only Rachel Phaneuf and one other person made her feel welcome. Every meeting, find someone you don't know or don't know well and learn something about them.

PROGRAM SUPPLIES

Constructing the Quilt Carrier

January 13, 2011 Albertha Brown

- 1 ½ yards guilted reversible fabric
- 1 pkg double-folded ½-inch bias tape to match your fabric
- 1 heavyweight cardboard for bag bottom. I suggest the kind that a bolt of fabric is wrapped around (free at Joann Fabrics)
- 5/8 yards of fabric to cover the board—cut 2 rectangles 10 x 25. Choose fabric to coordinate with your bag; fabric does not need to be quilted. Please pre-cut your cardboard to 24" long.
- 2 ½-inch dowels, each cut to 22 inches long. You may paint them if you wish.

Recommended: a walking foot

The cutting of the bag parts is very simple and quick; we can do this in class. You will also need to bring the necessary supplies to class:

Sewing machine Rotary cutter/scissors Cutting board (large) Matching thread Large ruler (6" x 23")

NOTE: I will try to bring some extra cardboards to class.

NEWS FROM THE BEEKEEPER

The bee lasts through lunch. The hostess may provide lunch or we may brown bag it. Bring a project to work on or share a completed project or just come for the fellowship. It's a great way to get to know your fellow guild members. This year at each bee you will learn a new technique, see a new gadget demo'd or find out about a new book or pattern—something different each month. Last year we made felted wool pin cushions, received music CD's, made self-portraits, had the opportunity for a massage, learned how to use the Clover yo-yo maker, learned a new method and gadget for sewing seams, and added many new, delicious recipes to our collections. January Bee: Join us at the home of Dorene Bickford on Thursday, January 20, at 9:30 a.m. for the first bee of 2011! Dorene is always such a wonderful hostess. She will provide lunch so be sure to call or email her to reserve your spot. Dorene will demonstrate an easy method of installing a zipper (for all those bags that are so popular now). If you would like to try this for yourself, bring 2 strips of fabric 2 ½" x 7" folded and pressed in half lengthwise and 2 strips 2 ½" x 7" not pressed and a nylon zipper at least 7" long (can be longer). Dorene will have extra zippers if you need one. You'll go home with one of the very popular pencil bags sold by Ways & Means last year.

FEATURED MEMBER CATHY HANRAHAN

How long have you been quilting? Barely two years; I'm just a beginner!

Who taught you how to quilt? I took a class from a gal at church who taught us a block a month from Eleanor Burn's Quilt in a Day pattern and then I just started a couple of other quilts from patterns I liked. I really need more classes and enjoy learning so much at our guild meetings and from all the experienced quilters who are so willing to teach us.

What are your favorite quilting techniques? I'm too new at this to have a favorite technique and have mostly only done pieced work. There are many techniques to try in the coming years.

What are your favorite colors to work with? I love the teals, turquoise and blues; but I also enjoy the bright spring colors. I have much to learn about colors and putting them together as I am always amazed when I see some of the wonderful color combinations used by some of the guild members.

What are your favorite fabrics to work with? I've only worked with cotton but maybe someday I'll try something different.

What is your favorite quilt shop? I do not have a favorite quilt shop. I tend to go to the one that is closest or on my way to another destination. I have found it fun to stop at different stores as my husband and I travel. My husband has become a good sport about looking around quilting shops.



If you sew by machine, what kind(s) do you use? I own a couple of Bernina's, one I just purchased last year for the quilting accessories.

What inspires you to make a particular quilt? I like to look through magazines and enjoy the guild's show & tell. There are way too many ideas out there and I want to try so many of them; but there isn't time to do it all. Right now I look for more simple patterns and pretty colors.

What is your favorite quilting book or pattern? I enjoy looking at several books and magazines for ideas.

On average, how many quilts do you make in a year? So far, I've only made 4 last year. How do the other guild members find time to make 10 or more a year?

Do you quilt your own quilts or do you send them out? I am learning to quilt my own by machine and trying to get the hang of free motion.

What quilt-related item(s) are you working on right now? I have a butterfly quilt started for my granddaughter and then a couple of more patterns and material ready for 2011.

What other hobbies do you have? I enjoy sewing for my granddaughters, reading and traveling to new places. I also like to do volunteer work at my church and walking daily with a friend.

Tell about one way that quilting has changed your life. I have learned to think some outside my comfort zone in sewing and putting together patterns and colors. Also, I've enjoyed meeting other quilters and have learned to really appreciate all the time and effort that goes into any quilt.

Are you on any committees with the CRQG? I am on the Membership Committee for 2011.

Feel free to tell us more about yourself and your family. My husband and I are both from Southern California and met at college in Utah. We moved to Georgia over 20 years ago for my husband's job. We have three grown children, plus 1 son-in-law and 1 daughter-in-law and 7 grandchildren so far. Our lives center around our family and our church. I have started making quilts for the grandchildren and know that my daughters are waiting for one also. So I have plenty of future projects. My husband and I also have been traveling since his retirement and feel very blessed with full and active lives.
