President's Message

Happy New Year !!



10 of us braved the ice to attend the Guild meeting Thursday morning Jan 12. If you could get out of your subdivision, the roads were pretty clear. Albertha told us how to make her quilted bag and I finished mine on Saturday! She has agreed to do the lesson again in February and if you miss that she probably could be talked into doing it again at the next QUILT-TIL-U-WILT.

We still have no Ways and Means Chair and the two members of that committee work and can only attend the night meetings. Pairs of people on the Executive Board have agreed to take a month and prepare something to be sold or raffled off. We still need people for Sep, Oct, and Nov so see how things go for the next couple of meetings and see if you can volunteer.

My turn is June and I'd like your help. I want to raffle off quilt blocks and I'd like lots of you to make a block for that raffle. I'll demo the block at the next several meetings. It's string pieced and made from scraps. Cut a pre-washed piece of muslin 13" square. Lay one strip of fabric right side up on the diagonal. Lay the next piece right side down on the first piece, sew, and iron open. Repeat in both directions. Turn block over and trim using the muslin as a guide. The strips can be any width - usually 1.5" to 3". Looks better if strips vary in width. I will also raffle off the quilt bag I made. Albertha says they sell for **\$80.**

Hope you got lots of quilting done while you were iced in. Bev Mahle re-organized her sewing room.


How long have you been quilting? Since 1988

Who taught you how to quilt? I learned in California in a quilting class taught by Diane Leighton.

What are your favorite quilting techniques? I like to piece quickly so love chain piecing but I also enjoy hand work, both appliqué and quilting. I especially like the math involved in planning a quilt.

What are your favorite colors to work with? I seem to go through phases of favorites but since most of my quilts are scrappy I guess I like all colors.

What are your favorite fabrics to work with? 99.9% of the time I use cottons.



If you sew by machine, what kind(s)do you use? I use a Janome 6600 at home and a Janome Gem at workshops. I still have the Singer Featherweight I sewed garments on in the 60s and a Bernina that's never quite worked right.

What inspires you to make a particular quilt? It could be anything from a pattern to a book to a quilt hanging in a show.

What is your favorite quilting book or pattern? I don't know that I have a favorite.

On average, how many quilts do you make in a year? I started to keep a photographic record by year of quilts completed and was surprised to count eighteen in 2010. However, I start a lot more than I finish each year! My UFOs are each in a separate plastic box and easily number in the dozens. I try to finish a least one of them each year and have now given myself permission to give up on those that deep down in my heart I know I won't ever finish. A couple of those end up in the Rauction every year.

Do you quilt your own quilts or do you send them out? I send most of them out, especially anything bed sized. I'll attempt to machine quilt, but it's not my sharpest skill.

What quilt-related item(s) are you working on right now? I've got two quilts for friends at the machine quilter's right now and another that I'm going to machine quilt myself after I finish the project that I started when my son was four. He's now almost 27.

What other hobbies do you have? I'm a voracious reader and movie goer. Although you wouldn't know it by looking at my yard, I'm a Master Gardener and volunteer at the Plant a Row for the Hungry located at the Smith-Gilbert Gardens in Kennesaw. I also love to travel.

Tell about one way that quilting has changed your life. In 1987 we moved from urban Southern California to rural Northern California. I don't think I've ever been more miserable. One day a woman I'd met at the park (our sons were the same age and had the same big wheels so became instant buddies) invited me to the quilt show put on annually by the local guild. I walked into that building, took one look and thought I'd died and gone to heaven. Somehow that town of 25,000 people had a quilt guild with nearly 300 members! I joined the guild that day and enjoyed every minute of it. I never did like living in that town so was beyond thrilled when my husband's job took him to Atlanta. Big change #2: In 1995 we moved to Kennesaw. The first week in Georgia I went to an East Cobb Quilt Guild meeting where I met Jean Ann Wright. She called me the next day, offered me a job and suddenly I found myself the Managing Editor of Quilt magazine, a position I held for the next nine years.

Are you on any committees with the CRQG? This year I'm the Georgia Quilt Council liaison.

Feel free to tell us more about yourself and your family. My husband Jim retired a few years ago and now spends most of his time on the golf course. We split our time between Kennesaw and the Florida panhandle. Jim likes to travel, too, so we make frequent trips to the west coast to visit family and try to take one Big Trip requiring a passport each year. Our son Jay is in grad school at UGA.

Community Service

Get your motors running...heading down the highways!! Oh, excuse me! My other hobby was taking over my brain for a few minutes. I guess with all the inclement weather I have a little cabin fever! Well, it is still time to get your motors running...your sewing machine motors that is as we kick off another year of community service. I am pleased to announce we will be doing small (lap size) quilts for the Head Start program of Douglas Co. This program helps prepare 4 & 5 yr olds for kindergarten and they are eligible for the program in two ways. The family must be at *poverty level or below* or there be a disability. Douglas Co. currently has 141 children enrolled in this program. The director was very willing to give me all the information I needed and only works with the program here in Douglas Co. She assured me the quilts will go to the "neediest of the needy" and will definitely stay in our county. Our guild has done -on average- 25 quilts the past 2 years, so based on that we will commit to 25 quilts for Head Start. In the past you have always surprised me with your willingness to go above and beyond. With the need being so large this time and kids being the recipients, what are you willing to do?

The quilts displayed at the hospital for the first quarter are from Joyce Hill and Sandy Capazzi. New CRQG business cards(new meeting place) are printed and will be distributed at the next meetings.
