President's Message

Someone told me that in any group 10% of the members do 90% of the work. That does not apply to Cherokee Rose Quilt Guild. I am amazed at how people step up and take on projects.

When we didn't have a Ways and Means Chairperson, someone on the board suggested that pairs of board members take a month and come up with something to raffle. 20 people promptly volunteered. Linda Jones and Annie Kellum raised over \$120 on their raffle basket for Feb!! Brenda Senn raised Over \$60 on her ironing board raffle in just one night!

Lots of members do things for the guild and don't ask to be reimbursed.

We have 67 members. At the Feb night meeting 36 people voted to move our meetings from the Downtown Conference Center to the Hunter Park Community Center. The rent is the same: \$40/meeting and there is storage space for our 4 trunks. There are 100 parking spaces, so we should not be plagued with parking shortage which seems to have happened at every meeting downtown. Since more than half of the members voted to move, we don't have to vote at the day meeting.

So starting in March, we will be meeting at Hunter Park, room #208. Go in the front door of the new building, turn right, last door on the right.

Directions: From Hwy 92, turn right on Broad St (hwy 78) go about 1.5 miles west, turn left on Gurley Rd;

Don't take the first Hunter Park exit on the left – that area is still under construction. Go to the 2nd left – sign says HUNTER PARK COMMUNITY CENTER.

<u>From I-20</u>, take exit 34 and go North on HWY 5. Go thru red lights at the exit ramp, at the Wal-Mart turn, and at Rose Ave. About a mile from the exit, turn right onto Gurley Rd. There is a small sign that says Hunter Park. Take the 2nd right – sign says HUNTER PARK COMMUNITY CENTER.

See you there. You'll be pleased with the facility – nearby bathroom has 5 stalls !!!



Challenge Quilt

Two Color Quilt Challenge

- 1. Must use Red/White <u>or</u> Navy/Off White for colors. Can be either not both or mixed.
- 2. Must be not less than 12" square and not more than 36" square. Can be 144" total perimeter if you want to make it rectangular or round. Not less than 48" total perimeter.
- 3. Must have a nine-patch block somewhere on quilt. Remember there are many different kinds of 9-patches, such as shoo-fly, monkey wrench, etc. Also many 9-patches together form a checkerboard. The entire quilt could be a 9-patch.
