President's Message

Be careful leaving the Community Center. Thursday night Annie Kellum fell over the concrete block in front of her car and broke a finger. She had gone to her car alone. Perhaps we should go out with someone else when we leave.

I enjoyed Joyce Maxwell's talk on organization, which I really needed. I decided to start with my entry hall which has only one wall to worry about. It's been a month and I haven't succeeded in organizing that one wall. My excuse is that my daughter gave me a book CUTTING THE SCRAPS by Joan Ford. Joan has you cut scraps into 5", 3.5", and 2" squares and then gives you 20 patterns that use that size. I got so carried away with that idea that I cut up 4 large boxes of scraps and now have about 10 shoe box size plastic boxes with neatly cut scraps and made a quilt from one of her patterns. I went thru 3 rotary blades and managed to BREAK a titanium blade. In the process of doing this, I found several small unfinished quilts and finished them. There were enough Mile-a-Minute blocks to make 3 donation quilts which I gave to Bev Thursday night and I have 6 more tops that need to be quilted and they will go to Bev for our donation quilts. Then there are about 6 more tops that I haven't decided what to do with.

My sewing room still looks like the kids have run amok in it but Phyl can tell that it's a lot better than it was. Let's not talk about the room upstairs with the fabric.

We had great response with members meeting other members, finding out interesting facts about them and sharing with the rest of us. We'll do that more often.

I started out doing Mile-a-Minute as Dorene taught us but ended up doing more like log cabin with odd scraps. Good way to use up little lost 4 patches, half-square triangles, etc and just keep adding strips to them. Then get your 6.5" square ruler, lay it at an angle and cut up your block. You can sash or not and border or not. Dorene may have some handouts or you can Google Mile-a-Minute.

This is my year to finish up as many UFOs as possible.

Challenge Quilt

Two Color Quilt Challenge

1. Must use Red/White or Navy/Off White for colors. Can be either not both or mixed.
2. Must be not less than 12" square and not more than 36" square. Can be 144" total perimeter if you want to make it rectangular or round. Not less than 48" total perimeter.
3. Must have a nine-patch block somewhere on quilt. Remember there are many different kinds of 9-patches, such as shoo-fly, monkey wrench, etc. Also many 9-patches together form a checkerboard. The entire quilt could be a 9-patch.
