President's Message

A nominating committee has been selected:

Phyl Schiwal, Linda Herren, and Sandra Wilson.

They will come up with nominees for President, VP, Day and Night secretary and treasurer.

One person has already volunteered to serve. If you would like to chair or be on a committee or to be one of the 5 elected officers, contact one of the ladies on the nominating committee. If you haven't held an office ever or if it's been a long time, consider volunteering. That will keep Phyl from asking you to be President.

Ways and Means has done well this year. Since nobody agreed to be chair of that committee pairs of members have volunteered to take a month coming up with things to raffle or other ways to make money. Phyl and Dori made the guild about \$200 with their yard sale. I think that should be an annual event.

The program committee is probably the hardest working group – since they have to come up with 22 programs each year. I think we have 3 volunteers for that committee for 2012. We'd like to have 4 members on that committee and have 2 rotate off each year so there is continuity. This year's committee has done wonders with a greatly reduced budget.

I'll be teaching another machine quilting class Oct 1 for 9 - 1 or 10 - 2. If there are no more than 5 taking the class, it will be held at my house and we won't have to pay rent so all the money will go to the guild. Fee is \$10.

If more than 5 sign up, we'll meet at Hunter Park or some larger facility. You bring your own machine. Be sure you know how to drop the feed dogs and that you have a darning or quilting foot. They are usually a circular foot and may have a plastic plate with a hole for the needle. Some are C shaped. Bring 2-3 24" squares sandwiched with batting, muslin or light colored or plain fabric, and whatever fabric you don't like on the back – or muslin on the back. You don't want fabric with a design – hard to see what you are quilting.

Several people who took the earlier machine quilting class showed Head Start quilts that they quilted themselves!! Hooray for you !!!

Our project will be easy enough for those new to paper piecing and challenging enough for those with experience.

Do Kaleidoscopes look difficult or intimidating with all those sharp points and numerous pieces? Learn the easy way in a paper piecing workshop on October 8th taught by Sarah Sorenson. Make one block to use it as the center for a medallion quilt or more blocks – the choice will be yours.

Sarah has been paper piecing for about 16 years, almost as long as she has been quilting. Her love for the technique of paper piecing is obvious when you see her miniature quilts and wall hangings. She has taught paper piecing classes and conducted workshop for a number of shops and guilds. In 2004 she had the opportunity to sew for Jodie Davis, a nationally known author and president of QNN in Jodie's book 10, 20 30 Minutes to Learn Paper Piecing. More recently, Jodie commissioned Sarah to complete the blocks needed for a full size quilt. Sarah has also taken classes with quilt designer, Judy Neimeyer, whose paper piecing patterns are absolutely stunning.

Challenge Quilt Two Color Quilt Challenge

- Must use Red/White <u>or</u> Navy/Off White for colors. Can be either not both or mixed.
- 2. Must be not less than 12" square and not more than 36" square. Can be 144" total perimeter if you want to make it rectangular or round. Not less than 48" total perimeter.
- 3. Must have a nine-patch block somewhere on quilt. Remember there are many different kinds of 9-patches, such as shoo-fly, monkey wrench, etc. Also many 9-patches together form a checkerboard. The entire quilt could be a 9-patch.
