Kaleidoscopes – Making Complicated Blocks Easy Workshop

Our project will be easy enough for those new to paper piecing and challenging enough for those with experience.

Do Kaleidoscopes look difficult or intimidating with all those sharp points and numerous pieces? Learn the easy way in a paper piecing workshop on October 8th taught by Sarah Sorenson. Make one block to use it as the center for a medallion quilt or more blocks – the choice will be yours.

Sarah has been paper piecing for about 16 years, almost as long as she has been quilting. Her love for the technique of paper piecing is obvious when you see her miniature quilts and wall hangings. She has taught paper piecing classes and conducted workshop for a number of shops and guilds. In 2004 she had the opportunity to sew for Jodie Davis, a nationally known author and president of QNN in Jodie's book 10, 20 30 Minutes to Learn Paper Piecing. More recently, Jodie commissioned Sarah to complete the blocks needed for a full size quilt. Sarah has also taken classes with quilt designer, Judy Neimeyer, whose paper piecing patterns are absolutely stunning.

Persons 12 years or older may participate as a paid member. Persons 12-17 must be accompanied by an adult member of the guild.

CURRENT: H. Historian: Shall maintain historical records and scrapbooks of newspaper articles, pictures, programs and assorted memorabilia of Guild activities. The Historian shall be in charge of Record Book of quilts by members and award golden scissors. The photographer will be a member of this committee.

PROPOSED: G. Historian: Shall maintain historical records and scrapbook of newspaper articles, pictures, programs and assorted memorabilia of guild activities. The Historian shall be in charge of Record Book of quilts made by members and awarded golden scissors and will document the history of Cherokee Rose Quilters Guild and include in the scrapbook. The Historian will be given the golden scissors form. After recording them in the scrapbook, the forms will be destroyed.

ARTICLE NINE – MEETINGS

CURRENT: Section Three: Meetings are intended for enjoyment by adult quilters both members and visitors. Children may attend only if they are paid members and capable of participating in Guild activities.

PROPOSED: Section Three: Meetings are intended for enjoyment by adult quilters, both members and visitors. Members may bring visitors 12 years old and older to visit and participate.

OFFICERS, STANDING AND AD HOC COMMITTEES

Job Description (in addition to those in the by-laws)

CURRENT: Golden Scissors – Organizes the show and tell portion of our meetings. Responsible for passing out golden scissors/pin Awards and collecting the Golden Scissors Form. All Rules and forms are included in the Membership Booklet.

PROPOSED: Golden Scissors -- Organizes the show and tell portion of our meetings. Responsible for passing out the golden scissors/pin Awards and collecting the Golden Scissors Form. The information on the form (name of person, name of quilt pattern and the award that was given) shall be published in newsletter with the picture of the quilt. The forms are given to the historian to record in a scrapbook and the forms are discarded. All Rules and Forms are included in the Membership Booklet or on the Website.

CURRENT: Day and night hospitality are separate.

PROPOSED: Hospitality chairperson maintains supplies for both day and evening hospitality. The chairperson shall have helpers who will be responsible for providing snacks/food for day and night meetings. The chairperson along with the helpers will coordinate with the Program Committee to organize lunch, usually participants bring brown bag if program is going to last through lunch. The chairperson will arrange for someone to arrive early to make coffee and set up mid-morning snacks. Recruits guild members to provide refreshments and/or assigns tasks. Ensures proper clean-up and secure cabinet. ____Yes ____No

CURRENT: Photographer – takes pictures at meetings of important activities and members' Show n' Tell Quilts. Makes two (2) copies of the photos and gives one to the Historian and one to the quilter. (Also takes photos of events (speakers, workshops, etc.) for the Historian.)

Photographer – Takes pictures at meetings of important activities and members' Show n' Tell quilts. Makes a copy of the photo and gives to the Historian. A quilter can request a hard copy of the photo or an e-mail of a digital copy. Also takes photos of events, i.e. speakers, workshops, etc., for the Historian.

- Retired (2006) Art Teacher, most recently in Fulton County at Haynes Bridge MS and Chattahoochee HS
- Former Adjunct Student Teacher Supervisor and Computer Technology instructor at Georgia State Univérsity

- Grew up in Jackson, Mississippi Resident of North Fulton since 1973 Wife Jackie Hollingsworth, Music Teacher with Fulton County (died October, 2010) Two children (both Librarians), two grandchildren (both boys 2 more boys due in December)

As a teacher I taught everything from jewelry making to sculpture, printmaking, photography, drawing and painting, ceramics to research skills and assisting my wife with a general music class and producing musicals.

After retiring in 2006 I joined the Chattahoochee Evening Stars Quilt Guild in Alpharetta where my wife was a member. I made my first quilt the next year for my first grandson and the rest is history.

In 2008 I joined the East Cobb Quilt Guild and am currently responsible for hanging our show in September and next year will be chair of the Challenge Quilt competition. About four years ago a small group of fiber artists in Cobb County formed a group called Fiber Art Fusion. I joined the group the next year and now I serve as President. We are a group of artist who work with fiber in traditional and contemporary methods.

I have won, two viewer's choice ribbons, a sponsor's choice ribbon, several blue ribbons and a red ribbon and my bee group's quilt won first place and Best Original Design award in the CES 2010 show.

I very seldom choose to do something I have done before. My quilts sometimes take a traditional design and put a new twist on it. Many of my pieces have a humorous twist. My best quilts are those that require the viewer to spend some time thinking about what the work is about.
