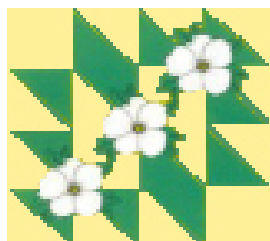

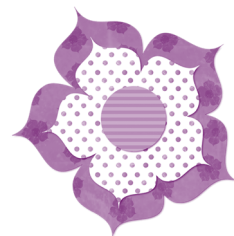

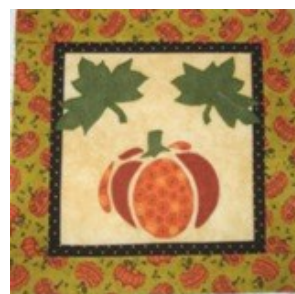
CRQG Program News

Our program for the September 12 day meeting is a fall appliqué workshop taught by Sarah Sorenson. Sarah is an excellent teacher; her plans are to teach the class with all skill levels in mind. If you are a beginner, she plans to give you the help you need with the basics. If you are experienced at appliqué, she will have several patterns available so you can start your project quickly. The *three** choices for your project are shown at right. A list of materials for this class is on our website. We need to add to the list the following: small rotary mat and cutter, iron and ironing surface, extension cord or power strip. Don't forget to bring your lunch! We plan to sew until about 3:00pm.

The September 28 night program is the Quilt Challenge. We would love to see a large group of participants this year. It is always fun and inspiring to see what everyone did with their challenge.

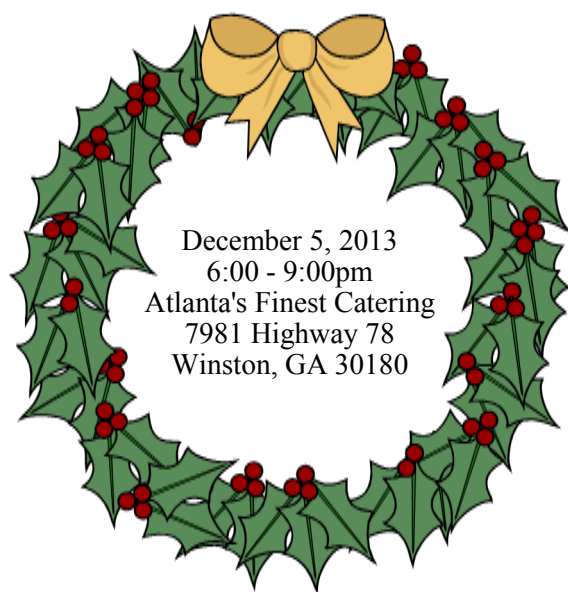
Just a quick reminder about our October 10 day meeting. We will teach the "Circle of Nine" quilt class. If you make your 9 blocks before-hand (12" finished is best), the class will be more entertaining for you. If you don't like making blocks that large, make them smaller, for example 9" blocks will do. Our class will be about how to set your nine blocks and finishing options. It should be fun and entertaining seeing what everyone comes up with for their design. The information and links to two free sample patterns are posted on our website under "Programs and Workshops."

Bee Recipes



Simple Quiche

½ lb. ground beef or sausage, browned
½ lb. (8 oz.) cheddar cheese, grated
4 lg. eggs, slightly beaten
1 Tbsp. cornstarch
1 can cream of mushroom soup
Salt & pepper to taste
1 deep dish pastry shell

Mix all ingredients together and pour into pastry shell. Bake 50-55 min. at 350° until center is set. Yield: 6-8 servings.

Strawberry-Pretzel Salad

First layer: 2 cups crushed pretzels (not too fine; measure after crushing)
¾ cup butter (12 Tbsp.), melted
3 Tbsp. sugar
Second layer: 8 oz. cream cheese, softened
8 or 9 oz. Cool Whip
½ cup sugar (optional)
Third layer: 2 (3 oz.) pkgs. strawberry Jell-O
20-24 oz. pkg. frozen sliced strawberries w/sugar
2 cups boiling water

First layer: Mix pretzels, butter and sugar. Spread in 10 x 13-inch pan. Bake for 8-10 minutes at 400° Cool completely.

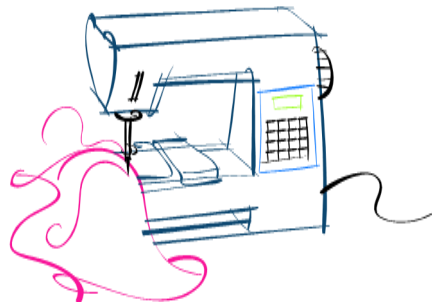
Second layer: Mix cream cheese, ½ cup sugar and Cool Whip. Spread on cooled crust.

Third layer: Dissolve Jell-O in 2 cups boiling water. Stir in frozen strawberries (do not thaw). Stir until berries are mostly thawed and mixture is partially set. Pour over second layer and refrigerate until fully set (minimum 2 hrs.). Yield: 12-15 servings

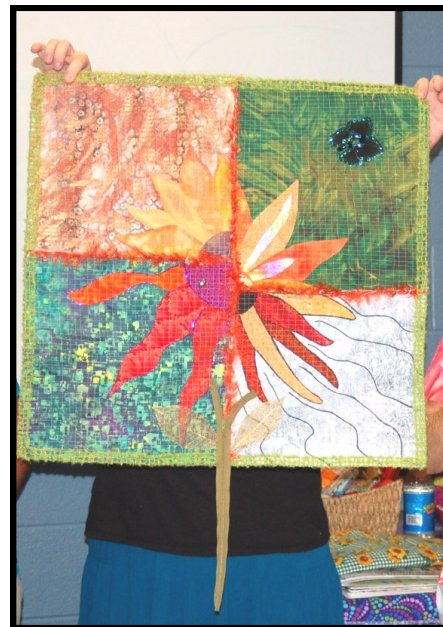

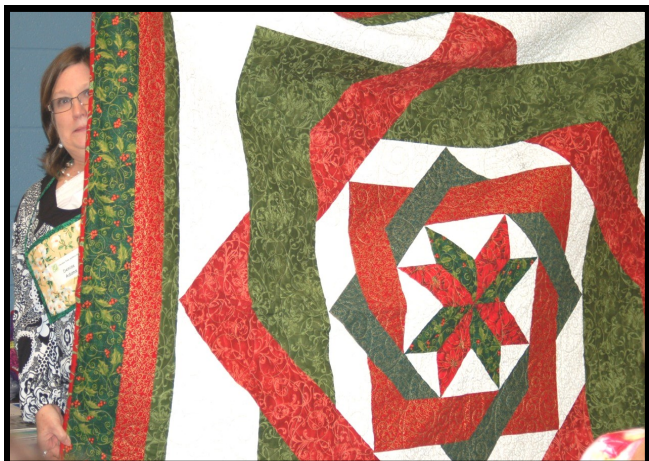
