CRQG Program News

- At our **October 9** day meeting, Marge Frost will teach us how to use old neckties to make a vest! Here are some tips that will help us prepare for the Necktie Vest:
 - Find a pattern you like. It should not have any darts or princess style seams because you will want to lay the necktie strips on a flat muslin base.
 - It is a good idea to make a muslin sample to be sure of fit, length etc.
 - You will want to have the neckties taken apart before you come to the meeting, as the process can be a bit tedious. By the way, you do not have to use ties! Any mix of fabric strips will work. And, you can also use the technique to create a great looking pillow.

For the meeting, you need to bring the following:

- Muslin base for front parts of vest.
- Sewing machine, thread, scissors...the usual sewing accessories.
- Cutting mats, ruler (12" or more, but you won't need a big one), rotary cutter
- Ironing equipment

Do not expect to complete this project at the class. You will get a great start. Plan to bring your lunch and stay until 2:00pm.
