SELECTED COMMITTEE OVERVIEWS

Newsletter is the official Cherokee Rose Quilt Guild publication that members can receive either electronically on the Guild Web site or in hard-copy format through the mail. Through the newsletter, members are provided with minutes of meetings, kept up to date on Guild business, introduced to new members, and kept informed of current and future Guild activities. The newsletter is published monthly.

Quilt 'Til You Wilt is back! The first quilt 'til u wilt to be held in 2009 will be on March 7, 2009. It will be held from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. Everyone is welcome—bring whatever you want to work on. This time will be our first ½ off quilt 'til u wilt. The cost is \$5 (1/2 the normal \$10), but you must bring a fat quarter (any solid color or something with flowers) and a notion (e.g., thread, needles, pins—something everyone is always using—nothing expensive or big). Everything will be placed in a basket and at the end of the event, those who are still there (haven't quite wilted) will have a chance at taking everything home. There will still be hourly drawings and lots of fun. Lunch will be potluck, so everyone bring a favorite dish so we can all taste each other's cooking. Then, for the evening meal, will be leftovers or if someone wants to go out and bring something back. Sodas and coffee will be furnished and there will be dessert and freshly baked yeast rolls. So everyone mark your calendar and pack the car or trunk and come have a full day of fun!

Ways and Means will be introducing a new "money raiser" called "Share the Wealth." It will be a 50/50 split on the monies collected, with half going to the Guild and half being awarded the winning ticket holder. We will probably enjoy that "game" a few times during the year. We would like to encourage everyone to contribute **usable** scraps to our pink scrap hopper as well as buy a bag or two for themselves. Scraps are \$1 per bag. We are also checking out the possibilities of new items for members to purchase. As always, we still have some DVD's, CRQG Cookbooks, CRQG Pins, CRQG Tote Bags; and we still have 2 Seascape kits available.

Web site is an additional tool for members who prefer to get their newsletters and Guild news electronically. It is also a resource for prospective members and visitors to find our Guild. This year, a calendar has been added to the Web site and all pages have been updated.

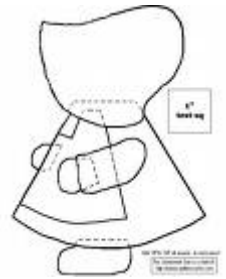

0 – 10 years



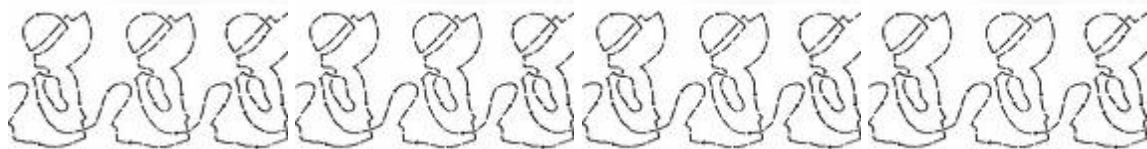

Measuring a Quilt

If you have a quilt to show at a Cherokee Rose meeting, you want to measure it accurately and record those measurements on the Golden Scissors form included in this, and every, newsletter. To do that, you need to find the perimeter of the quilt by adding up the lengths of all sides of the quilt.

For example, if your quilt is 70" x 80", you would add the sides, $70" + 70" = 140"$. Then, you would add the ends, or other two sides, $80" + 80" = 160"$. Finally, you would add those two totals together to find the perimeter: $140" + 160" = 300"$. Since your quilt's perimeter would measure greater than 220", you would earn a golden scissor. If your quilt's perimeter had measured less than 220", you would have earned a golden pin.

Project Supply Lists

Mile-a-Minute (March 12)

Lots of scraps, any size that is 6" or less and any shape
 Lots of strips (any width from 1 ½" to 3")
 The strips can be 18" to 45" long; crooked or straight
 Sewing machine
 Extension cord
 Light (if you need one)
 Power strip to share, if you have one
 Scissors
 Grey or tan thread for the top
 Bobbins (this is a good project to use up all those odd bobbins of thread that you don't want any more)
 6 ½" x 6 ½" ruler
 Iron and ironing surface
 Rotary cutter
 Rotary mat (you can use a small mat for this project—a 12" x 12" rotating mat or a 12" x 18" mat will work)
 Straight pins are NOT needed
 Something to throw your discards into (a thread catcher or brown lunch bag taped to your table will work)
 Anything else that will make you comfortable while you sew

Tuna Can Hexagons (April 9)

Prior to the meeting, cut 7 circles using a tuna can or something larger as a template.
 Think in terms of Grandmother's Flower Garden – one circle will be the center and the other six will be the surrounding petals. Usually 6 are the same color and the center is a color that goes with the other six. This is all hand sewing.
 Bring needle, thread, thimble, scissors.
 If you want to do more than 7 hexagons, bring tuna can, fabric and scissors, or cut more circles before time.
 This is the idiot-proof way to make hexagons. Great for a take-along project.
 I will have a handout for the meeting.
