MINUTES OF JANUARY DAY MEETING, JANUARY 14, 2010

There was no treasurer's report due to the finalizing of the 2009 records.

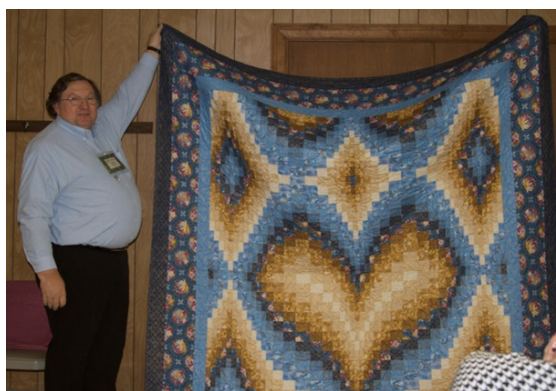

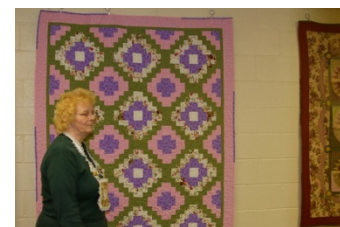

CHEROKEE ROSE QUILTERS GUILD**MINUTES OF THE JANUARY NIGHT MEETING, JANUARY 28, 2010****SUBMITTED BY JEANNE ANDERSEN, NIGHT SECRETARY**

The meeting was called to order by Rachel Phaneuf, President. Rachel asked us to pay attention to the papers on the tables and to make use of them during the year. The pink forms are for comments and suggestions; the others list committees and people in charge of them. Offer help when you can.

Dori welcomed everyone and encouraged us to be positive and to participate and communicate with the leadership.

Six members have birthdays in January and were recognized.

Committee Reports

Treasurer – We have \$4,025.18 in the account. There are more deposits that have not yet been noted.

Publicity – New quilts are hanging at the hospital for January through March. Thank you, and think about offering your quilt for the next quarter for hanging; if you wish, it can be for sale. The new publicity flyer for the Guild, which is still in the works, will be business card size. This will be easier to carry to hand out to people you meet and for the store to place in their businesses. Caryl has an embroidery machine and has a Cherokee rose pattern she will put on the shirt of your choice for a donation to the Guild.

Ways and Means – There will be a raffle at each meeting. Cost is \$1 per ticket or \$5 for 6 tickets. There will be baggies of fabric cut to size—either strips or squares for sale. And occasionally there will be gift items for sale as well. Remember that items can be donated throughout the year for the fall R'Auction—check the committee list for a person to give it to.

Membership – There are 37 members and 4 new members present: Robin Banks, Gail Ford, Sarah Groves, and Abby Davis. Two visitors also attended, Joni McKenzie and Traci Morgan. Door prizes were won by Jeanne Andersen, Abby Davis, and Pat Oliver. Fat quarters were won by Rita Perez. Other new members since the membership packet are Bobbie Brooks, Jerilyn West, and Kathy Hanrahan. Charlene Shanks gifted Jessie Quick with fabric she had admired at a R'Auction.

Just for the Fun of It – We all got a gift from Rachel: a fabric valentine card and pattern. What a nice treat!

Community Service – There will be two projects this year. The Douglas County Homeless Shelter needs bedding, and we have offered to make 18 quilts, 14 twin and 4 full size. Please use a polyester batting. There will be a commitment sheet to sign. Please make sure the quilt is totally finished and ready to use. Also, for the Boys and Girls Club of Douglasville, we are making pillowcases. We would like a total of 170 cases. They are easy and quick. Vickie already has 25 donated. Put them in a bag of some sort and hand them in. Standard size is appropriate for boys and girls. American Patchwork magazine has a quilt challenge we will be part of with our pillowcases.

Hospitality – Charlene passed around a sheet for signing up for February night meeting. Please bring your food if you sign up.

Sunshine – Cards were sent in December to Joyce Trew, Irene Gardner, and Rachel Phaneuf. In January, cards were sent to Annie Kellum, Phyl Schiwal, Connie Tallant, and Pat Oliver. Caryl Knox's daughter-in-law needs our prayers; Betsy's friend Mary has had a number of crises in her life causing much stress.

Library – Jennie Hollis reported that there will be a book review in the newsletters and she will have a list of books available. Please check this valuable resource as you plan your next project.

Programs – Robin handed out plans of how the committee will proceed through the year. They will plan through June of 2011 so that the new committee members will not be caught short for the start of the year. And they hope that this will be an example to follow in the future. Please read the sheet for more information. February day meeting will be a project of paper piecing. The floral design quilt will be sewn by the quilters present and later sold. The funds will go to the Guild. February night meeting will be a guest who will share with us her collection of kimonos. March day will be Marge Frost who will bring her scrappy quilts and talk about color and composition. March night will be a representative from the Georgia Quilt Council who will share plans about the new museum. Tonight's program is QUILT-O. It was fun, and we need a redo because Susan won 3 times at our table!!!

Photography/Historian – Charlie noted that the pictures are on the table in the foyer and asked if we would bring any articles or other mentions of the Guild for him to file.

Quilt 'Til You Wilt – Two Saturdays have been planned, May 1 and November 6. To take part, bring something to work on—or just come to gab. Also, bring a fat quarter, a notion, food to share, and \$5.

Challenge Quilt – Patti has made it simple this year. Draw a fat quarter from her basket and use that as inspiration for your any-size quilt. More to follow.

Telephone – No report.

Bees – January Bee was at Kathy Eck's house. February will be at Ann Marie Mangiosi's. Call her to let her know you are coming—food is involved!

Old Business: None

New Business: A new budget was presented. A motion to accept it was made by Jane Wilding and seconded by Aline Wadsworth. The motion passed.

The Georgia Quilt Council has asked the guilds in the state to donate a quality quilt to be put on display as part of the initial exhibit in the new Southeastern Quilt and Textile Museum in Carrollton. Later the quilts will be auctioned as funding for the museum. Later the quilts will be displayed under the dome of the capitol. Rachel asked if there was agreement and support to undertake this project. It was agreed upon.

There is a new quilt shop nearby: Kiwi Quilts. Check it out!

For the Georgia Quilt Council in March we are making a door prize consisting of a basket of fat quarters. Please donate quality fabric. This is representing our Guild.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

We will have two opportunities again this year for our members to join in the Community Service Project! Our first mission is to provide 18 (or more) quilts to the Douglas County Homeless Shelter. They have 4 full beds and 14 twin beds. When someone comes into the shelter, their bedding is "checked out" to them and they are responsible for the care of it; the shelter provides the laundry facilities on site for them. The quilts for this project need to have POLYESTER batting, please!

Our second mission is 175 pillowcases for the Douglas County Boys & Girls Club. They have 150-160 school age "kids" (6-18) who attend their after-school programs, so we will give these as a "Back to School" type item in the summer. They try to teach the younger kids about getting the proper rest at night for school, so this will go hand in hand with what they are working on. As an added bonus, there is a national program to make 1 MILLION pillowcases sponsored by a quilting magazine so I will be signing us up in that! By the way, there is a "friendly" competition to see who can turn in the most pillowcases, and a prize will be given for the quilter who achieves that goal. I've already had several say they will make 10 each. . .won't be long until we are at our goal!!

Due to a few problems encountered last year, there will be a short agreement to sign if you are willing to make a quilt for the shelter. The due dates for these 2 missions haven't been decided yet but will be soon. There will also be a few guidelines on how to turn in your pillowcases; I will once again collect and store both the quilts and pillowcases until they are given away.

You overwhelmed me last year with your giving, so let's get started and make 2010 even better!

GEORGIA STATE QUILT COUNCIL

The exciting news from the Georgia State Quilt Council is that the “talk” of establishing a museum is becoming a reality nearby—in Carrollton. The goal is to “exhibit the work of Georgia quilters, preserve their quilts, present educational programs and serve as a resource center for the study of the role of quilts and quilting in the culture of Georgia and the USA.” Further, this new regional quilt/textile museum “is poised to join the ranks of the other great quilt museums in the United States.” They plan to open early in 2011. Our very own Robin Meyers spent many hours raising funds from quilt auctions on the Internet for this fine museum. When the following information came the end of last October, it was decided to wait until the new year to discuss it, but that was not well thought out by me; fortunately, it was discussed at Rachel and Charlie’s last Monday night. Patti Howell has volunteered to chair the making of the donation quilt.

The quilt our Guild makes will be used by the Quilt Council to raise funds at an auction with a beginning bid of \$500 each. The quilt is due January 2011. It will be hung at the Georgia State Capitol Gold Dome before the auction, just as the quilts were hung in 1996 for the Olympics.

WAYS AND MEANS

In January, the day meeting raffle earned \$122; \$5 was kept by the Ways and Means Committee to make change and \$117 was turned in to the treasurer. The day raffle winner was Rebecca Bobell.

At the night meeting, \$16.25 was earned; Sandra Wilson was the winner of the raffle.

Two new raffles are coming your way in February. Valentine’s Day represents love, and you’re going to love the **red** offerings this month.



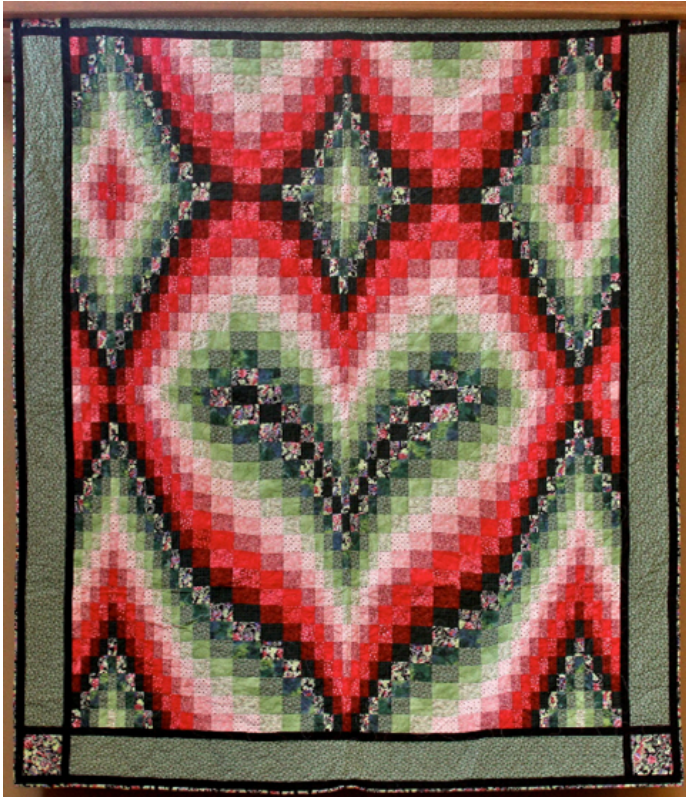

QUILT CHALLENGE 2010

PLAYING IN THE UNUSUAL

In an effort to improve participation in the quilt challenge this year, we are attempting to "Make it Simple."

Rule #1: You will be given a fat quarter at a meeting. Then you will be required to make a quilt (any size), drawing inspiration from the fabric. The quilt must be three layers, quilted and finished. You must use the fat quarter in the quilt. You can use all of it or just a portion.

Rule #2: HAVE FUN!!!

An award will be given to the person with the quilt voted as the best by the membership.

How long have you been quilting? I've been quilting seriously for about 18 months.

Who taught you how to quilt? Many classes!!!

What are your favorite quilting techniques? Definitely machine piecing. I have tried hand piecing—one block—and knew before I started it wouldn't be for me! Too slow!!!

What are your favorite colors to work with? Mostly pastels, but I love other color palettes and color lines.

What are your favorite fabrics to work with? Definitely fine quality 100% cotton.

What is your favorite quilt shop? Little Quilts and Quilts 'N Fixins.

If you sew by machine, what kind(s) do you use? I have a Viking Designer 1, a Babylock and a Singer Featherweight.

What inspires you to make a particular quilt? Usually a very beautiful quilt that I see, a particular pattern or really beautiful fabric.

What is your favorite quilting book or pattern? Hmm. . . the one I am currently working on at the time!

On average, how many quilts do you make in a year? Depends—usually about 10 to 12.

Do you quilt your own quilts or do you send them out? I pay to have them quilted—I really don't know how—Broach does a wondrous job!!! She's a genius!

What quilt-related item(s) are you working on right now? BOM from Quilts 'N Fixins, Internet technique quilt with Annie Smith, and Venetian Windows (pattern) using batiks.

What other hobbies do you have? My background in sewing is children's heirloom clothing (christening gowns, etc.)—love that, reading and being with my family and grandchildren.

Tell about one way that quilting has changed your life. It has introduced me to many new techniques, fabrics, shops, patterns and books! Love all the fabrics!!

Are you on any committees with the CRQG? I have volunteered for membership but haven't been contacted yet.

Feel free to tell us more about yourself and your family. I have lived in Atlanta since the 6th grade. I have been married to the most generous, loving man in the world for 37 years.
