The program was presented by Kember Pepper who shared her love of kimonos and how to construct quilts from them.



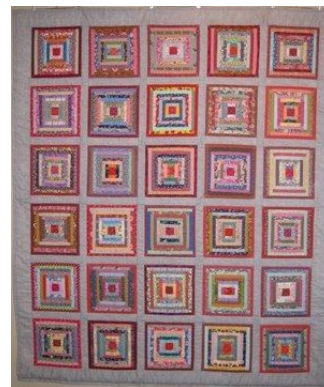
MARCH AND APRIL PROGRAMS

Spring offers a huge number of stimuli that inspire us to attack those new quilting projects we've been wanting to tackle. As our members and others share their talents with the rest of us, we have the opportunity to learn new techniques. Be sure to be at each meeting to take advantage of every learning opportunity.

March 11, 2010 Day Meeting

Scrap Quilting
Marge Frost

Marge Frost will share her approach to fabric selection for great looking scrap quilts and her technique for piecing a log cabin block with a variety of scraps in differing sizes. Bring your machine, some strips (between 1 ¼" and 2" wide), and basic sewing supplies. We'll pool our strips, mix and match, and make some fun blocks—and who knows what will turn up at Show and Tell in a few months? The program will end at about 2 p.m.



March 25, 2010, Night Meeting

Southeastern Quilt and Textile Museum
Frances Brooks, Georgia Quilt Council

Frances will share with us the current status and plans for the Museum, scheduled to open in Carrollton in spring 2011.

April 8, 2010

Crazy Eight Strip Teaser – Table Topper
Sandra Wilson

Sandra will show us how to make this great 4" x 4" table topper. Select holiday fabrics or colors to match your decor. It goes together really fast once you make the strips. The magic is in the cutting and piecing. We'll come with our strips sewn and spend our time cutting and assembling the topper so that you can go home ready to quilt. The program will last until about 3 o'clock. Information about purchasing the pattern will be available soon.



Fabric Needed:

8 ¼-yard assorted fabrics ranging from light to dark using a variety of prints and textures (do not prewash fabric—you need almost every smidgen of the ¼ yard—and **do not use fat quarters**)

5/8 yard binding

1 ¼ yards backing

1 ¼ yards batting

12 ½-inch square ruler (optional)

Cutting Instructions: Cut 6 – 1 ½-inch WOF strips from each of the 8 fabrics. Do NOT cut off the selvages.

Sewing Instructions: Arrange each of the 8 fabrics in order of value, dark to light. Sew strips together to form a strata. Use a true and accurate ¼-inch seam. As each strip is attached to the strata, sew from the opposite direction. This will prevent the strata from bowing and keep the unit straight. Make 6 separate strata.

Pressing seams: Press seams in 3 strata toward the dark strip and the other 3 toward the light strip.

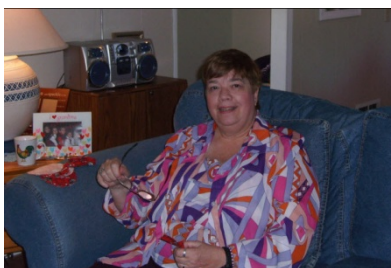
are having so much sewing fun with friends!

FEATURED MEMBER**RITA LEE**

How long have you been quilting? I've been quilting for 10 years.

Who taught you how to quilt? This is a good question. I took my first class one spring in 2000. There were four in the class. The instructor was from New Orleans originally but was returning from California that year. We were eager. We sat down and said, "What do we do first?" Jackie had garbage bags of fabric. She placed them in front of us and said, "Begin." She was a scrappy quilt artist. We learned to just let our creativity grow. However, Cely Pedesceaux and Marion Ancar were seasoned quilters I met about two years later. They took me under their wings, and I have been gradually learning traditional quilting. By the way, it took me six months to complete that first quilt. It was titled "An Open Book" and it hangs today over the staircase in my home.



What are your favorite quilting techniques? I like crazy quilts, and I am beginning to like paper piecing.

What are your favorite colors to work with? Vibrant colors, jewel tones and rich earth tones.

What are your favorite fabrics to work with? I like cotton and flannel.

What is your favorite quilt shop? I like "Red Hen" or "Mother Hen" in Marietta. I can always find what I want there.

If you sew by machine, what kind(s) do you use? I have a Brother and Husqvarna.

What inspires you to make a particular quilt? Life.

What is your favorite quilting book or pattern? I don't really have a favorite. The quilting book I have used the most is the *Elm Creek Quilts*. I am a visual learner so I don't look to books or patterns usually. I create my own.

On average, how many quilts do you make in a year? It depends on the year. I guess you could say 2-3.

Do you quilt your own quilts or do you send them out? Both. I hope to learn to machine quilt soon.

What quilt-related item(s) are you working on right now? I make aromatherapy heating pads; I am working on Saints wall hangings; and I have a request for two quilts, one for Mother's Day and the other for "as soon as possible."

What other hobbies do you have? I love audio novels. I listen to them as I quilt. I love to cook and spend time with my children.

Tell about one way that quilting has changed your life. Quilting slows me down. Everywhere I look on a daily basis I see a quilt in nature ready to be made. Quilting makes me take time to smell the roses. As you can see, I am a fidgety, talkative person. It is soooooo hard for me to keep still. Quilting solves that problem for me.

Are you on any committees with the CRQG? I am the night librarian.

Feel free to tell us more about yourself and your family. I am the mother of three teenagers. My husband Steve and I have home schooled our children for the last 7 years. My youngest is 14 (Rena); she has applied to Our Lady of Mercy High School for next year. She will be in 10th grade next year. I don't think she wants to be alone at home next year. Besides that, I really think Rena is ready for something new in her life. Rena loves horses, dogs and music. She will be the musician like Dad. My middle son (Christopher) has cerebral palsy. He is 17 and attends Alexander High. He really enjoys school. It was a big step for us to place him in a public school this year. He is pulling together his own peer group and that is outstanding. 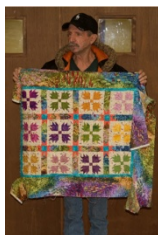
