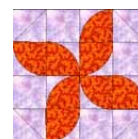
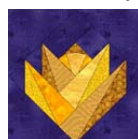
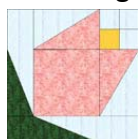
There! That is my spring challenge to you! It will be interesting to see all the colors you will choose, and don't forget those great greens!

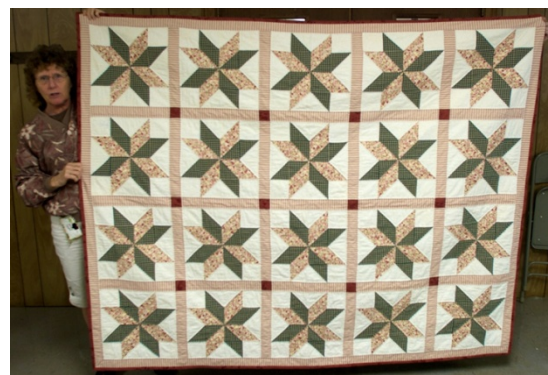

I know it’s the beginning of Spring, but that shouldn’t stop you from thinking about your Christmas gifts. This is the perfect time to pick out the project for your kids, grandchildren or anyone you hold dear. To help with the selection, here are some books you can check out from our library if you are a member.

[Quilt in a Day Star Log Cabin Quilts](#) by Eleanor Burns. For anyone who hasn’t tried a log cabin block, here’s a great place to start. This book takes you from the basics of block construction to finishing the top. A variation on this design can be found in [The Neverending Scrap Quilt](#) by bdieges. The designs in this book appear to be more complicated, but don’t be discouraged—it’s the presentation that’s difficult. Pull out your holiday fabric and let the creating begin.

[The Thimleberries Book of Quilts](#) by Lynette Jensen. If you like traditional quilts with a twist, look for some wonderful ideas in this book. Some of the projects are simple enough for beginners, and others will challenge the expert in us.

[Through the Year Quilts](#). Take your pick; one of the 17 quilts shown here is bound to meet your creative needs. I just love the Technicolor Clamshell (log cabin block). Paper piecing is your thing? Well, that’s in here, too.

[Spinning Pinwheel Quilts](#) by Sara Moe. Haven’t tried curves yet? Well, this is the book for you. From beginner to expert, the choice is yours.

Do you quilt your own quilts or do you send them out? I quilt my own.

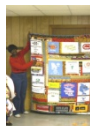

Paper Bag Mystery (May 14, 2009)

Sewing Machine
Scissors, thread, etc.
Rotary mat, ruler, and cutter
Fabric will be supplied.

Ort Jar (June 25, 2009)

3" wooden embroidery hoop (you will use inner hoop)
4" x 8" cardboard (cereal box weight)
Fat quarter of fabric
4" square of thin batting
Embroidery floss or thread to coordinate with fabric (you will need only 18" or so)
Fabric glue or glue stick
Hand sewing needle, thread, thimble, and scissors
