Meet this months CRQG featured member: Irene Gardner

- How long have you been quilting? I've been quilting since 1975.
- What got you started in quilting? I had to find some way to use up all my scraps from making clothes for myself and my children.
- Who taught you how to quilt? I am self taught. Just kept trying and finally my Mormon Mother-in-law took me to a Ladies Aid Society meeting at her church and they were making a quilt. They helped me figure out what I was doing wrong...not measuring any of my blocks to be exact!
- What are your favorite quilts to do, i.e appliqué, piecing, paper piecing? Machine piecing and drawing my own designs for hand appliqué.
- What are your favorite colors to work with? I can tell by looking at my fabric stash that I am drawn to reds, blues and purples.
- Favorite fabrics, ie Batiks, floral, kid prints? My favorites are the fabrics printed with unusual designs on them...like toasters, flying saucers, desserts, shoes, etc.
- Favorite Quilt shop? Quilts and Fixins! They are always so very friendly!
- If you sew by machine, what kind of machine(s) do you use? I have an old (15yrs) European White machine. I love it. A real workhorse which can withstand all the carrying to and from home to workshops and classes.
- What inspires you to make a particular quilt most often? Our guild's Show and Tell, Magazines, quilt shows, and artwork by others.
- Favorite quilting book or pattern? Oh my...this would be like choosing a favorite child! LOL!
- On average how many quilts do you make in a year? On average, about 6-10 tops a year. I
 usually only actually finish about 3-4 of them though.
- Do you quilt you own quilts or do you send them out? I hand quilt my own quilts. I wish I could afford to send them out! I use the Big-Stitch because I get my quilts finished faster with this method.
- What quilt related item are you working on right now? Right now I'm busy trying to finish all the tops I've started in classes and workshops.
- What other hobbies do you have besides quilting? I've become addicted to Scrapbooking.
 Surprisingly it is much like quilting! Except with scrapbooking we use paper, tape and gluesticks. I love to design pages for all my photography. I also enjoy gardening and a bit of decorating.
- One way that quilting has changed your life? Over the years quilting has brought me many good friends who share some of my same interests.
- Are you on any committees with the CRQG? If yes what committees? No committees this
 year but I am the Guild Treasurer.
- Feel free to tell us more about yourself and your family below. I am very lucky to have a husband and family who love what I do and never begrudge the time and money I spend on my quilting hobby. I also have a sister, a niece, and a daughter who share my love of making quilts. We have made guilts together in the past and its very nice to have guilts we all have made together.

aMAZing Challenge Quilt Rules

It's almost the night before the aMAZing Challenge Quilts are due. . . better get started now before the clock strikes twelve and your challenge turns into a pumpkin. Let your quilt be the "glass slipper" found by the charming prince and shared with the guild at the September night meeting. Shock us all (and yourself) and get started now! Doreen and phyl

The a _MAZE_ing Quilt Challenge Rules

- 1. Cherokee Rose LOGO must appear on the front. The fabric printed logo will be provided or can be pieced.
- 2. Sew at least 4 mitered corners wherever borders or bindings are used.
- 3. Minimum SIZE: MAZE itself at least 24" sq; total QUILT at least 36" square.
- 4. SHAPES: Square or rectangular.
- 5. BACKGROUNDS: Pieced or wholecloth.

The a _MAZE_ing quilt must have at least 1 ENTRY point and 1 EXIT point

However, multiple entry or exit points are OK.

You may enter more than one a _MAZE_ing quilt.

Include the grand/child in the design and/or sewing of the quilt. Make this an interactive quilting project for the child and you.

Revised Supply List for One-Block Wonder Workshop August 18th from 9:30am – 5:00pm Door will open at 9:00am for setup

Cost is \$5.00 – You must be paid and signed up by August 9th

Bring your own lunch and snacks; drinks will be provided

- Book: One Block Wonder by Maxine Rosenthal
- Fabric: See book for information Do Not Pre-wash or Iron Fabric
- Large Rotary Cutting Mat
- Rotary Cutter 45mm or 60mm with a new blade (will be cutting 6 layers of fabric)
- Rulers: 6" x 24", 6" x 12" with 60° Lines (or similar size rulers to cut 3¾" strips and triangles)
- 100 Flat Flower or Butterfly Head Pins
- Sewing Machine with 1/4" foot, or whatever you use to sew a 1/4' seam
- Thread
- Basic Sewing Supplies
- Container to hold finished blocks 7" x 7"
- Extension Cord

Optional: Portable Design Wall: You can use fleece, flannel, felt, cotton batting, etc. A Folding Cardboard Cutting Mat (36" x72" when opened) with one of the above put over it will work.

If you have, bring the following:

Bed Lifts (elevators)

Seam Roll

60° Triangle Rulers

Small travel iron or the iron that looks like a curling iron
