Newsletter

At the last Board meeting it was decided to split the functions of the newsletter editor and webmaster. I will address the webmaster function separately.

The computer application that I use to produce this newsletter is Microsoft Publisher. When Joany turned the newsletter over to me, the format was in that application. I liked the setup, so I continued to use it. I bought my own copy of MP so I could continue in the same format.

The newsletter editor for 2009 does not have to use Microsoft Publisher if she/he does not have it or does not want to use it. The publication can be produced using any number of word processing applications. You will need to devise your own format with whatever program you use, if you choose not to use MP.

I am putting together some "cheat sheets" for the process of putting together the newsletter. I don't want to discourage anyone, but I do believe in full disclosure. It does take a lot of time. There has never been a time this year when I received all items by deadline time. The editor must print mailing labels and make sure to add those for visitors from the last meeting. When the newsletter is finalized, it must be taken to a printer to make copies for those who want mailed copies vs. receiving on the website. Then the copies are taken to the post office, folded, mailing seals applied, labels and postage added, then finally mailed. I have had help sometimes with the printing and mailing, but not every time. It is the responsibility of the newsletter editor to have it printed and then mail if volunteers are not available to help.

I'm hoping someone will soon make the commitment to take over this job in the coming year. I am planning new activities and a change of direction in my life, so I will not be available much in 2009. I would like to have someone ready to publish the December edition, as I did in 2007 when I first started.

Jam Bars - by Vickie Pruitt

1½ cups sifted all-purpose flour; 1 tsp. baking powder; ¼ tsp. salt; 1½ cups quick-cooking oats, uncooked; 1 cup firmly packed brown sugar; ¾ cup butter or margarine; ¾ cup fruit jam or preserves (strawberry, raspberry, and apricot are all good);½ cup chopped walnuts (opt.). Combine flour, baking powder, and salt; stir in oats and brown sugar. Cut in butter with a pastry blender or fork until mixture resembles coarse meal (I just use my hands!) Press two-thirds of mixture into an ungreased 11-x-7 baking dish. Spread jam over surface; stir walnuts into remaining oats mixture, if desired, and sprinkle over jam. Bake at 350° for 30-35 minutes. Cool; cut into bars. Yield: about 2 dozen *I used strawberry preserves for the ones I brought to the guild.

Taco Bites by Vickie Pruitt

Filling: ¾ cup mayonnaise; 6 tsp. sour cream; ¼ cup buttermilk; ½ pkg. taco seasoning mix (or more to taste); tbsp. lemon or lime juice; 4 pkgs. (60 total) frozen mini phyllo shells (in freezer section, next to pie crusts); finely grated carrots, tomatoes, lettuce, or other desired vegetables*. Combine filling ingredients and refrigerate overnight or at least several hours in advance to allow flavors to meld. To assemble, place phyllo shells on cookie sheet and bake at 350° for 5 mins. until hot. Remove from oven and cool completely (doesn't take very long). Spoon filling into shells about ¾ full. Top filling with shredded vegetables and serve. Refrigerate leftovers, if any! *I used broccoli, carrots, and cauliflower on the ones I brought to the guild.

Supply List for Faces on Watercolor,

By Barbara Rainwater (Workshop)

You will learn the basics of watercolor design as well as many techniques to put faces on fabric. You will have your own finished wall hanging with the face of your choice. You will need a face of your choosing. Needs to be 6" to 7" from chin to forehead. Look through photographs, magazines, internet and even coloring books and size on copy machine. Embellishments and even silk flowers can be used.

1pkg. "solvy" water soluble stabilizer; 1 spray bottle with water: 1 Sharpie black ink permanent marker pen-fine point; black thread & bobbin; neutral thread & bobbin; Sewing machine in good working order; rotary cutter& mat; quilter's pins; scissors; steam a seam 2 lite for raw edge appliqué of fabric; embellishments; iron and ironing surface; bridal veil netting in your choice of color for face - I used lavender for spring, vellow for fall, blue for winter and red for summer. To make a "watercolor" background, chose a color scheme and get several pieces of light, medium and dark similar size small prints or florals. 1/8 yd. is plenty for you and enough to share. Cut these into 2" squares before class. I will also bring some to share. A plain background or pre-printed landscape panel could also be used. A fat quarter is plenty. I will supply the gridded interfacing and demonstrate many ways to do faces both opaque and transparent. There will also be a demonstration of many ways to embellish.
