



What are your favorite quilting techniques? I haven't been able to do one over and over. I just enjoy learning new things.

What are your favorite fabrics to work with? Cotton. I am really looking forward to doing something with batiks.

What is your favorite quilt shop? I really don't get to go anywhere but Joann's. Rachel took us to a shop this spring that was wonderful. I was sitting in the back seat of the car and have no idea where we went!

If you sew by machine, what kind(s) do you use? Sears Kenmore

What is your favorite quilting book or pattern? Fat Quarter Quilts by Mliss Rae Hawley.

Do you quilt your own quilts or do you send them out? I send them out. My hand sewing abilities are such that I need lots of practice, and my machine limits me—and that would mean that I wouldn't get to piece very much.

What quilt-related item(s) are you working on right now? A mariner's compass for my oldest grandson. And a bargello for Rachel's class, and a jelly roll.



What other hobbies do you have? Reading—my family has been known to go eat out while I finished a good book. I used to play golf all the time; but now that I work, my time is limited and the heat bothers me. . . I'm at that age!

Project Supply Lists

Cathedral Windows (August 27)

- 2 11-inch squares (solid color)
- 1 3-inch square (different color from the solid)

Sewing notions: thread, needle, thimble, straight pins, scissors; anything you would like to use for hand sewing.

There will be several sewing machines and irons provided to start, but most of the sewing will be hand stitching.

Triangles Into Diamonds (October 8)

Suggested to have: 4" or larger **60° Equilateral** (all 3 sides the same) Triangle Ruler

Some Examples:

Fons & Porter – Pyramid Ruler (Joann's has) Marti Mitchell – Triangle Ruler Creative Grids – Triangle or the Triangle Duo Alicia's Attic – Clearview Triangle

Will Work:

Small EZ – Pyramid Ruler with the Blue Edge, used for the One Block Wonder 6" x 12" Rectangular Ruler with 60° lines
