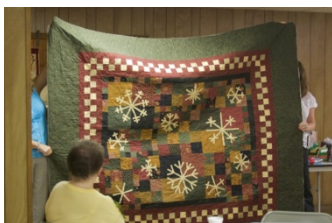
Vintage Style Quilts by Floral Roberts

A BITE OF THE BEE

Simple Chicken Cordon Blue

- 4 boneless, skinless chicken breasts (thin and pounded so it's easy to roll)
- 4 slices Swiss cheese (you can use provolone)
- 4 slices prosciutto (Italian ham) sliced thin (you can use regular ham sliced thin)
- ¼ Cup all-purpose flour
- 1 egg, beaten
- ½ Cup Italian seasoned bread crumbs
- ½ Cup Panko crispy bread crumbs
- 4 Tablespoons butter

Pound chicken breasts to ¼ -inch thickness. Sprinkle each piece on both sides with salt, pepper, & garlic powder. Place 1 cheese slice and 1 prosciutto slice on each breast. Roll up each breast using toothpicks to secure if necessary. Dredge each in flour (shake off excess) then in egg, and finally in combined bread crumbs. Place seam side down in baking dish that has been sprayed with Pam (I use olive oil spray). Place 1 Tablespoon butter on each piece of chicken. Bake at 350 for 35 minutes in preheated oven until juices run clear. (I prepared this the day before and kept refrigerated)

Sauce for Top

(I did not use because I was serving it with cold salads)

- ½ Cup chicken broth
- 1 Cup whipping cream

In saucepan, combine broth and whipping cream; season to taste (salt, pepper, garlic powder, oregano). Simmer on low stirring until thickened. Pour over chicken.

R'AUCTION

Please make sure that your items are in good condition, and please try to put your items in boxes. This makes for easier storage and keeps items in better condition. Please give your items to Albertha Brown, Broach Winsley, or Sandy Capazzi. If possible, maybe you can let them know before you bring them to a meeting so that they will be prepared to take the items home.

Orzo Salad

- 2 lbs. uncooked orzo
- ½ Cup chopped fresh basil
- ¼ Cup chopped parsley

Dressing

- ¾ Cup olive oil
- 6 Tablespoons red wine vinegar
- 2 Tablespoons lemon juice
- 1¼ teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon pepper
- 6 oz. grated Parmesan cheese

Cook orzo al dente. Drain, rinse with cold water, and drain again. Add basil and parsley. Combine dressing ingredients in a jar; cover and shake. Pour over salad and toss. Refrigerate. Just before serving, add Parmesan cheese and toss. Makes 20 cups.

(I cut the recipe in half for the Bee.)

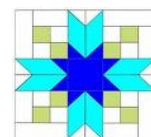
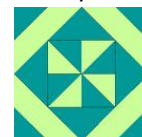
Quilt 'til You Wilt

Project Supply Lists

Color Mastery (September 10)

Color Mastery book

- scissors
- tape or glue stick
- rotary cutter
- cutting mat
- color journal – either a blank journal or pages printed from the Color Mastery CD
- Photocopy of Color Wheel, Value Wheel, and Intensity Wheel (I give permission in the book for you to copy these for class. They are also available to print from the Color Mastery CD.)
- Small amounts (fat quarters or smaller) of these hues (look on the color wheel for help in identifying these):
 - yellow
 - yellow-orange
 - orange
 - orange-red
 - red
 - red-violet
 - violet
 - blue-violet
 - blue
 - blue-green
 - green
 - yellow-green
- 1 ½ yards of a fabric in your favorite color. You'll be cutting this into fat quarters and coordinating color palettes with it. You can cut it into fat quarters ahead of time if you like.

Triangles Into Diamonds (October 8)

Suggested to have: 4" or larger **60° Equilateral** (all 3 sides the same) Triangle Ruler

Some Examples:

Fons & Porter – Pyramid Ruler (Joann's has)
 Marti Mitchell – Triangle Ruler
 Creative Grids – Triangle or the Triangle Duo
 Alicia's Attic – Clearview Triangle

Will Work:

Small EZ – Pyramid Ruler with the Blue Edge,
 used for the One Block Wonder
 6" x 12" Rectangular Ruler with 60° lines
