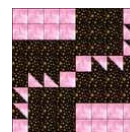
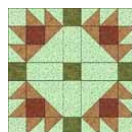

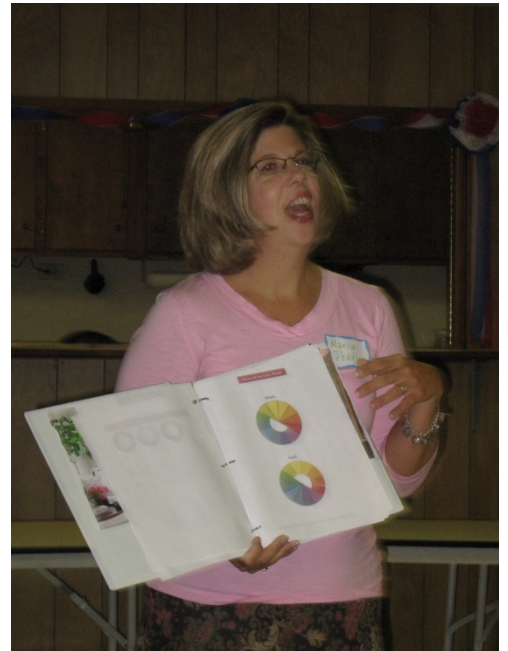
Newsletter – Diane appreciates everyone's help in getting articles to her on time.

FEATURED MEMBER EMMA PARKER

How long have you been quilting? I started quilting in 1991.

Who taught you how to quilt? I took a class from Trudie Hughes at Patched Works in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

What are your favorite quilting techniques? I like planning the quilt and machine piecing.

What are your favorite colors to work with? I love working with brights.

What are your favorite fabrics to work with? I love Batiks and Japanese fabrics even though they are not brights.

What is your favorite quilt shop? My favorite shops are in Milwaukee, Wisconsin: Bigsby's Sewing Center and Patched Works. I have not lived in Georgia long enough to visit many shops.

If you sew by machine, what kind(s) do you use? Bernina 200E.

What inspires you to make a particular quilt? Most of the quilts I make are for others. I try to find an appropriate pattern for the occasion or the person.

What is your favorite quilting book or pattern? I do not have a favorite book or pattern.

On average, how many quilts do you make in a year? I only made two or three quilts per year because I was working. I plan on increasing (that number) now.

Do you quilt your own quilts or do you send them out? I send them out. One of my sons recently purchased a long arm quilting machine and I plan on attempting to learn to use the machine or have him quilt them.

What quilt-related item(s) are you working on right now? I am working on a courthouse steps quilt from the workshop with Flavin Glover. I also started working on a UFO designed by one of the members of my Milwaukee quilt guild.

What other hobbies do you have? I love to travel, read and do needlepoint.

Tell about one way that quilting has changed your life. I love being able to make something beautiful for others. Working on a quilt also has a calming effect.

Are you on any committees with the CRQG? I recently joined CRQG and have not had an opportunity to join a committee.

Feel free to tell us more about yourself and your family. I have been married to my husband for 40 years as of September 13. We have three children, two sons and a daughter. We also have three grandchildren, two grandsons and a favorite granddaughter. My sons live in Alabama and my daughter lives in Atlanta. They talked us into moving to Georgia. In Milwaukee, I worked as an Administrative Law Judge and retired to move. I sincerely miss working. I hope that I will soon begin enjoying retirement.

A BITE OF THE BEE

Mrs. Arnold's Cornbread

2 pkg. Jiffy cornbread or 1 C corn meal + 1 teasp. baking powder

1 8-oz can cream style corn

1 C sour cream

½ C vegetable oil

2 eggs

½ teasp. salt

Mix all of the ingredients together well. Pour into well-greased 8 x 8 pan. Bake at 450 degrees for 20 min. Serve warm

Green or Red Pepper Jelly Dip

½ jar green or red pepper jelly (found in jelly section of grocery store)

1 8-oz pkg of cream cheese, blended smooth

½ C chopped pecans

Blend all together. Chill. Serve with crackers.

Dump Chili

Brown 2 lbs or more ground meat; drain

Add:

1 chopped onion; saute

1 chopped clove of garlic

2 cans diced tomatoes

2 cans tomato sauce

1 can stewed tomatoes

2 cans red kidney beans, rinsed

¼ C chili powder + salt and pepper to taste

Mix all together

Cook on stove or in crock pot (H) for several hours to mellow flavors together. Serve hot with sour cream, cheese, Frito chips and rice

Kit Kat Bars

About 75 club crackers—enough for 3 layers in a greased 9 x 13 pan

Melt 2 sticks (1 C) stick margarine

Add:

2 C graham cracker crumbs

½ C milk

1 C brown sugar

1/3 C granulated sugar

Bring to boil stirring constantly; boil for 5 minutes

Put 1 layer of crackers on bottom of greased 9 x 13 pan

Pour ½ of boiled mixture over crackers

Place 1 more layer of crackers on top of boiled mixture

Pour the remaining boiled mixture over crackers

End with layer of crackers

Then melt:

½ C chocolate chips

½ C butterscotch chips

2/3 C peanut butter

Spread chocolate/butterscotch/peanut butter mixture over the top of the last layer of crackers

Chill for 1 hour; cut and serve

QUILT 'TIL U WILT

Saturday, November 7 (9 a.m. until 9 p.m.) come one, come all and enjoy the last Quilt 'Til U Wilt of 2009. Bring your projects, UFO's or anything else you want to work on. This is still a ½ off special - \$5 plus a fat quarter (since it's near Christmas, please bring a red or green or Christmas print) and a notion, eg., pins, thread, etc.-- just something small that you use all the time. Please bring a covered dish that can be shared as this is a pot luck type of affair. Come and have a good time and see what everyone else is working on. Hope to see you there!

COMMUNITY SERVICE

On hand as of right this minute, I have 21 cushions, 2 bags, 11 walker totes, and 1 lap throw quilt. That's the good news. PROJECT SUPPLY LIST

October 8th Day Program - "Triangles into Diamonds" by Denise Allee

Come join in the sewing or just watch (following the business meeting).

This will be a technique demo with options. Everything will be shown in a lecture first.

Bring a sack lunch if you plan on staying to sew.

Suggested to have: 4" or larger **60° Equilateral** (all 3 sides and angles the same) **Triangle Ruler**

Some Examples:

Fons & Porter - Pyramid Ruler (Joann's has)
Marti Michell - Triangle Ruler
Creative Grids - Triangle or the Triangle Duo
Alicia's Attic - Clearview Triangle

Will Work:

Small EZ – Pyramid Ruler with the Blue Edge, used for the One Block Wonder
6" x 12" Ruler with 60° Lines

Fabric:

4 fat quarters: 2 light/medium and 2 medium/dark (should have contrast between the colors)
Fabric should be washed (if you prewash). Don't bother to iron at home.
Bring more fat quarters if you want. They are sewn in pairs: 1 light/medium to 1 medium/dark
We just had a color workshop! Step out of your Comfort Zone – Try something New!
Some color combinations: Purple and Green, Purple and Red, Red and Neutrals, Blues and Whites, etc.

Seam Ripper

Rotary Cutting Mat that will fit a Fat Quarter

Rotary Cutter

6" x 24" Ruler

Sewing Machine with 1/4" foot, or whatever you use to sew a 1/4" seam

Sewing Thread

Extension Cord

Basic Sewing Supplies

If you have:

Pointed Tweezers (borrow from your bathroom)

Small iron – wand one will work
