Night Meeting Minutes, October, 25 2007

Caryl called the meeting to order. Robin moved to approve the minutes of the September night meeting, Ann Groves seconded the motion and the September minutes were approved as written. Caryl congratulated those with October birthdays. Irene gave our current balance as \$2,091.82. Irene also reported for Nominating Committee—Jessie Quick, Day Secretary; Ann Groves, Night Secretary; and, Caryl Knox, Treasurer. We still need nominees for President and Vice President. (After the break, Debbie Hirschman agreed to be President and Patti Howell agreed to be Vice President.)

Announcements by Caryl: (1) As a result of the Board meeting held prior to this meeting, the following bylaws changes will be in the November newsletter and will be voted on at both meetings in November. Due to the change in the bylaws, membership dues will be accepted at the Christmas Party but must be by check or exact change.

ARTICLE SEVEN - DUTIES OF OFFICERS AND STANDING COMMITTEES

Section Two: Standing Committees

C. Newsletter Editor: Shall publish a monthly newsletter for Guild members and visitors. It will be available electronically to all members and sent by regular mail, as provided in Article Ten, Section Two.

ARTICLE TEN – FINANCES

<u>Section Two</u>: Members shall pay yearly dues in an amount determined by the vote of membership. Dues, along with a membership form, are payable at any time during the year except during the Christmas Party. Members may elect to read their newsletter online by so indicating on the membership form. Members who request that their newsletters be mailed will be assessed an annual mailing fee to cover materials and postage. The mailing fee will be reassessed each year and adjusted as supplies and/or postage costs change. Only members whose dues are paid by December 15th will be included in the membership directory for the following year.

(2) A motion was made and second proposing to raise the dues for 2008 to \$20 per year. The mailing fee will be \$8 for 2008. This will be presented to the membership for a vote at the November meetings. (3) We received a thank you note from the winner of our outstanding door prize at the Georgia Quilt Council Convention. A challenge was issued to match or better our door prize at the next Convention.

Phyl told us what a great experience it was to host one of Sharon Schamber's workshops for the Convention. Thanks to Doris for helping to arrange a location.

Committee Reports:

Sunshine — Joany having surgery on November 27th.

Christmas Party — Caryl: We will be providing gift bags for Grace Assisted Living. You may fill a bag (a pair of socks, small box of Kleenex, a stuffed animal, and lotion) or give \$5 to Dorene who will purchase the items. There are 34 residents to supply with gift bags.

How long have you been quilting? About 10 years, off and on

What got you started in quilting? I've sewn since I was young enough to play with dolls, making clothes for them. As an adult I had a friend who kept encouraging me to get into quilting. I kept putting her off, somehow knowing that when I got into quilting it would take priority over everything else, which it has.

Who taught you how to quilt? I learned mostly from watching Simply Quilts, books and a few classes.

What are your favorite quilts to do, i.e appliqué, piecing, paper piecing? Piecing.

What are your favorite colors to work with? I just love all colors

Favorite fabrics, ie Batiks, floral, kid prints? Soft florals and batiks.

Favorite Quilt shop? I like all three of the Marietta shops, and I really like Sew Memorable in Dawsonville.

If you sew by machine, what kind of machine(s) do you use? Pfaff.

What inspires you to make a particular quilt most often? Seeing a sample in a quilt shop.

Favorite quilting book or pattern? I enjoy looking through a variety of different books and patterns. There are too many to pick a favorite.

On average how many quilts do you make in a year? It varies, but somewhere between two and five.

Do you quilt you own quilts or do you send them out? For the past four years I've quilted my own on my long arm machine.

What quilt related item are you working on right now? I'm making a diamond log cabin quilt in dark reds and olive greens for my husband for Christmas. He saw it and pointed it out to me in a shop in Blue Ridge about two years ago. I spent quite a long time collecting the fabrics for it and have finally gotten to the point of making it although he's probably already forgotten about it by now!

What other hobbies do you have besides quilting? I'm afraid quilting has squeezed out most everything else. In the past I did a lot of window treatments, cushions and pillows, and a little re-upholstery. I still enjoy reading.

One way that quilting has changed your life? I've made such good friends who share my love of quilting – that's the best part of quilting.

Are you on any committees with the CRQG? If yes what committees? Currently I'm one of the photographers.

Game Card Instructions

Materials for 1 (10 1/2") card

(Each fabric must be chosen from one of the following categories: batik, floral, geometric, heart, leaf, metallic, holiday, novelty, paisley, plaid, solid, star, stripe, or 30's print. Use a black print for the center square.)

- 5 (2 1/2") squares assorted yellow
- 5 (2 1/2") squares assorted red prints
- 5 (2 1/2") squares assorted blue prints
- 5 (2 1/2") squares assorted green prints
- 4 (2 1/2") squares assorted purple prints
- 1 (2 1/2") square black print

Block assembly

 Referring to the photo of the block, join 5 yellow print squares to make 1 row. In the same manner, make 1 red row, 1 blue, 1 green.
Join two purple squares. Make 2 purple pairs. Join one set on one side of the black square and another set on the opposite side. This makes the purple row.

3. Join rows, placing the purple row in the center.
